



Advocacy is the act of supporting or arguing in favor of an issue, idea, cause or person. When a family member is impacted by acquired brain injury, frequently a large part of the family carer/supporter role is in advocating for the needs of their loved one. Survivors of brain injury, we believe, are also often able to advocate on behalf of themselves, individually, and this is called self-advocacy. This session provides an overview of advocacy skills and gives examples of situations where you can utilise these skills for improved outcomes for yourself or your loved one. We will also give a listing of additional resources in case you need help to advocate for specific services or supports. This program has been developed by the Network's Program Manager, who has many years of lived ABI carer experience including successfully advocating for DS funding, rehabilitation access, equipment and grant applications.


