

## Juvenile Justice Resource Rundown

The following section provides an overview of new resources, publications, and other updates relevant to professionals and policymakers in the juvenile justice arena.

- **Industry e-Newsletters**
  - The [Reclaiming Futures e-newsletter](#) is sent out each Wednesday, providing stories and resources about juvenile justice and adolescent substance abuse and mental health treatment.
  - The Office of Juvenile Justice and Delinquency Prevention's [JUVJUST listserv](#) provides information on juvenile justice and other youth service-related publications, funding opportunities, and events.
  - The Annie E. Casey's Juvenile Detention Alternative has a monthly [JDAI Helpdesk](#) e-newsletter providing information on juvenile detention reform.
- **Strategies, Research, Tools & Other Practical Resources**
  - The Juvenile Justice Information Exchange serves as a resource hub and idea exchange through in-depth reporting, editorials and commentary, and audience engagement. The site's [Resource Hub](#), a partnership with the [National Juvenile Justice Network](#), pulls together information and resources that include research, toolkits, and links to national experts. The Hub has devoted sections on [Mental Health & Substance Use Disorders](#); [Community-Based Alternatives](#); [Juvenile Indigent Defense](#); and [Racial-Ethnic Fairness](#).
  - The MacArthur Foundation-funded [Models for Change](#) is a multistate initiative working to advance juvenile justice reform in order to ensure a more fair, effective, and developmentally appropriate approach. Recent publications include [Facilitating Access to Health Care Coverage for Juvenile Justice-Involved Youth](#).
  - The Juvenile Law Center works "to protect and advance children's rights in courts, legislatures, and executive agencies." They have developed publications such as [Protecting Youth from Self-Incrimination When Undergoing Screening, Assessment and Treatment Within the Juvenile Justice System](#).
  - The [Center for Juvenile Justice Reform](#) at Georgetown University's Public Policy Institute supports leaders in juvenile justice and related systems of care. The center provides a multisystems perspective and offers resources in support of this work.
  - [Juvenile Justice – Geography, Policy, Practice & Statistics](#) (JJGPS) is a new online database designed to help policy makers, advocates, researchers, and the media better understand and encourage juvenile justice reform. This website monitors nationwide change in the juvenile justice system by examining state laws and juvenile justice practice, combined with the most relevant state and national statistics. Currently featuring jurisdictional boundaries, JJGPS will also address juvenile defense, racial/ethnic fairness, juvenile justice services, status offense issues, and systems integration.
