French Adjunct, part-time, one to two semester leave replacement, begins August 2014, Pacific University, Forest Grove, OR. Masters required; PhD preferred. Teaching experience required.

Responsibility for teaching 2 French classes (FREN 101 and FREN 200 in Fall semester. In fall, the selected candidate will be teaching the FREN 101 class from 3:30pm to 4:35pm, and the FREN 200 class from 10:30am to 11:35am three times a week (M,W,F). If extended to the spring semester, responsibility would be for teaching 2 French classes (FREN 200, taught M,W,F from 10:30am to 11:35am, and FREN 311 "Composition and Conversation" taught M,W,F from 3:30pm to 4:35pm). In addition to teaching classes, other duties include holding office hours, partaking in French Club activities, and directing students' questions pertaining to advising and/or study abroad to the Chair of the French Program. The candidate will also encourage participation of French students in events and activities related to the World Languages and Literatures Department, including the annual Around the World cultural food festival.
