# REGISTRATION

# OPTION 1: Full Time Care 3:00p.m. - 6:00p.m.

\$70 student/week

## **Register NOW**

Includes an after school snack and the cost of the enrichment class(es) you choose. You may select up to 2 enrichment classes per day for SESSION I. Space in the enrichment classes is limited and is offered on a first-come, first-serve basis with priority given to FULL-TIME participants through July 31, 2014.

## **OPTION 2: Daily Care/Enrichment Class(es)** 3:00p.m. - 6:00p.m. \$15 student/day

## Registration begins Friday, August 1st

Includes an after school snack and the cost of the enrichment class(es) you choose for the day(s) of the week your child will attend for SESSION I. All students enrolled in an enrichment class are obligated for one full trimester of fees.

## **OPTION 3: Part Time Care** 3:00p.m. - 4:00p.m \$25 student/week

#### Registration begins Friday, August 1st

Includes an after school snack and participation in Tidewatch Time Monday through Friday until 4:00p.m. The cost of enrichment class(es) will be added, if selected.

## **OPTION 4: Drop-In Care** 3:00p.m. - 6:00p.m.

\$15 student/day (Cost based on actual attendance)

## Register NOW

Includes an after school snack and participation in *Tidewatch Time* until 6:00p.m. Registration is only required **ONCE** per year.

### **Morning Care** 7:15a.m. - 8:15a.m.

\$2 student/day

(Cost based on actual attendance)

### Register NOW

Students may participate in quiet games, and/or complete homework. Per RCS policy, students may not be on or around school grounds unsupervised. All students dropped off prior to 8:15 a.m. will be directed to Morning Care and charged. Registration is only required **ONCE** per year.

# Questions & Answers

# 1. How do I register?

**Online** registration is required for ALL Tidewatch programs via the <u>Parent Portal</u>. Please visit the RCS website (riverviewcharterschool.org) for Parent Portal log-in instructions and access.

# 2. How do I select my enrichment classes?

It is helpful to have the Tidewatch schedule in front of you when completing your registration. Students will participate in Tidewatch Time activities outside of their enrichment class time.

- 1) Log-in to the Parent Portal
- 2) Click on the "Enroll" tab
- 3) Select RCS and Session I
- 4) Select your **schedule** option (FULL TIME, PART TIME, MORNING CARE, MONDAY, TUESDAY, etc.).
- 5) Select your **enrichment class(es) for the day(s)** your child will attend. This will build your weekly schedule for Session I: August 13 - November

## 3. Where do I pick up and drop off my child?

Morning Care drop off is located at **EXIT D**, the CAFETERIA side door. \*NEW LOCATION After school care pick up is located at the Front Office.

#### 4. How and when do I pay?

All payments are made online through the Parent Portal. All registrants are required to enter a bank account or credit card for auto-draft. Weekly invoices are emailed at the end of each week on Friday. Balances are due IN FULL each MONDAY. Auto-draft occurs each Monday.

# SESSION I Enrichment Classes

## TIDEWATCH TIME (Tidewatch Staff) Grades K-8

Tidewatch Time includes time for homework and Compass Learning, along with indoor and outdoor play, creative activities, organized/group games and sports. Additionally, we have special guest presentations and visits from community organizations such as the Beaufort County Animal Shelter, local fire department and police officers, and the Clemson Extension Campus.

## JUNIOR NATURALIST PROGRAM (Kelley Luikey) Grades K-5

The Junior Naturalist program is designed for kids in grades K-5. We will explore and discover the natural wonders of our Lowcountry environment through observation, discussion and hands-on activities. Each class will feature a live "animal of the day" that we will get up close with and learn more about. The rest of class time will be devoted to studying & experiencing the natural world that surrounds us. Rev! This session we will add an archaeology component! Kids will learn through engaging activities how archaeologists uncover the mysteries of our human past and some of the highlights of our human ancestry.

### BOYS SOCCER (Coach Mike Bridge) & GIRLS SOCCER (Coach Caroline Dalton) Grades 3-6

Are you interested in representing RCS on the middle school soccer team one day? If so, then join us after school to show off your soccer skills and learn new ones! This soccer program will focus on conditioning, dribbling, passing, shooting, cooperation and teamwork to best prepare you for middle school soccer. Please bring shin guards, cleats and water each day.

PIANO LESSONS (Bonita Wreden) Grades 1-8 (grouped)

The group instruction lessons are based on the traditional John Thompson Method, music composition and theory. Students are asked to practice several times per week on their own and they will perform at the TIDEWATCH Showcase at the end of the trimester!

# MUSICAL GROUP (Bonita Wreden) Grades K-8

Let's start a band! Open to all ages, this musical group will include percussion, piano, guitar and voice. We will write our own sings to perform at the TIDEWATCH Showcase at the end of the trimester!

### QUICK START TENNIS (Greg Crosby) Grades K-2 & Grades 3-8

This program is a USTA competitive play format that features modified equipment and courts, allowing kids to rally and play the game of tennis earlier than the expected advanced lesson training. With shorter and narrower courts, lower nets and lower compression balls, kids build the confidence and ability to cover the entire court.

#### **GUITAR LESSONS** (Bonita Wreden) Grades 3-8

Students will learn basic chords, how to tune, and song writing. Students will need to bring their own guitar to class each week and are encouraged to sign up for the Musical Group class too!

# MUSIC & MOVEMENT (Mary Foster) Grades K-1

This class will explore the basics of music including rhythm, tempo, and more. We will play simple instruments including rhythm sticks and assorted bells as well as various percussion instruments. We will also learn sonas and dances to various music types so children are exposed to both familiar and not so familiar musical styles.

### BALLET/JAZZ COMBINATION (Elizabeth Sanders) Grades 1-3

This Ballet/Jazz Combo class provides an opportunity for dancers to learn the basic form and techniques of Ballet including terminology and flexibility. Jazz will have a theatrical focus with upbeat combinations with leaps and turns. Dancers will learn culminating dances for each discipline. Please bring appropriate dance attire to change into.

# MINI STINGRAYS CHEERLEADING & STAR STINGRAYS CHEERLEADING (Beth Birkhead)

Show your Stingray support at RCS pep rallies and basketball games! Learn cheers, chants, jumps, stunts and dances. This is a first-come-first-serve opportunity, there are no tryouts to make the "team". Please bring t-shirt, shorts and athletic shoes. Students participating in cheerleading will cheer at RCS basketball games beginning in November. Transportation to/from the games is the responsibility of the parent. Details on uniforms and game schedule to come.

#### ART FOR ART'S SAKE (Susan Brown) Grades K-2 & Grades 3-5

Students will explore design elements such as line, color, pattern, and texture to create one of a kind works of art. All materials will be provided. It is recommended for students to bring a large t-shirt or smock to wear during the class.

## GYMNASTICS (Holly Zapp) K only, Grades 1-2 & Grades 3-8

The Kindergarten class is an introduction to gymnastics and will focus on strength, flexibility, and beginner skill development. The older grades will learn basic to intermediate tumble skills. An evaluation of skills is required to register for the Advanced Gymnastics class which is designed for the advanced gymnast. All classes will develop tumbling skills along with an introduction to beam, bar, and vaulting techniques. Please bring appropriate gym clothes to change prior to class.

# MANNERS FOR THE MODERN WORLD (Mary Foster) Grades 3-8

This class has been created to help students understand the importance and relevance of manners in today's world, to learn skills that are valuable for a lifetime, and to have fun while doing it! We will talk about what etiquette actually means and learn skills such as properly introducing yourself, writing thank you notes, setting a table and table manners, and more.
