

The Women's Hormones and Aging Research Program (WHARP) at Brigham and Women's Hospital is seeking a Junior Clinical Faculty Member to work with our clinical research program to improve our understanding of mechanisms and treatments for menopause-related symptoms of hot flashes, depression, sleep disturbance, and fatigue. WHARP is based in the Department of Psychiatry at BWH and is closely affiliated with the Dana Farber Cancer Institute's Women's Cancer Center and Department of Psychosocial Oncology and Palliative Care. Our research is conducted in close collaboration with the Breast Cancer Program as well as with sleep medicine, endocrinology, gynecology, functional neuroimaging, vascular physiology, and pharmaco-genetics. Studies primarily involve healthy midlife women, cancer survivors, and healthy volunteers using clinical observation, intervention/treatment, and hormone manipulation study designs.

Successful candidates will have an MD, MD/PhD, or other advanced clinical degree, and will have completed clinical training relevant to the field of women's mental health research. The ideal applicant should have an interest in developing or strengthening clinical research skills and have demonstrated track record of these interests, including having worked on other research projects and authored original publications from previous research. Qualified candidates should possess excellent communication skills, creativity, self-motivation, and the ability to work both within a team and independently. Candidates must also be proficient in oral and written English.
