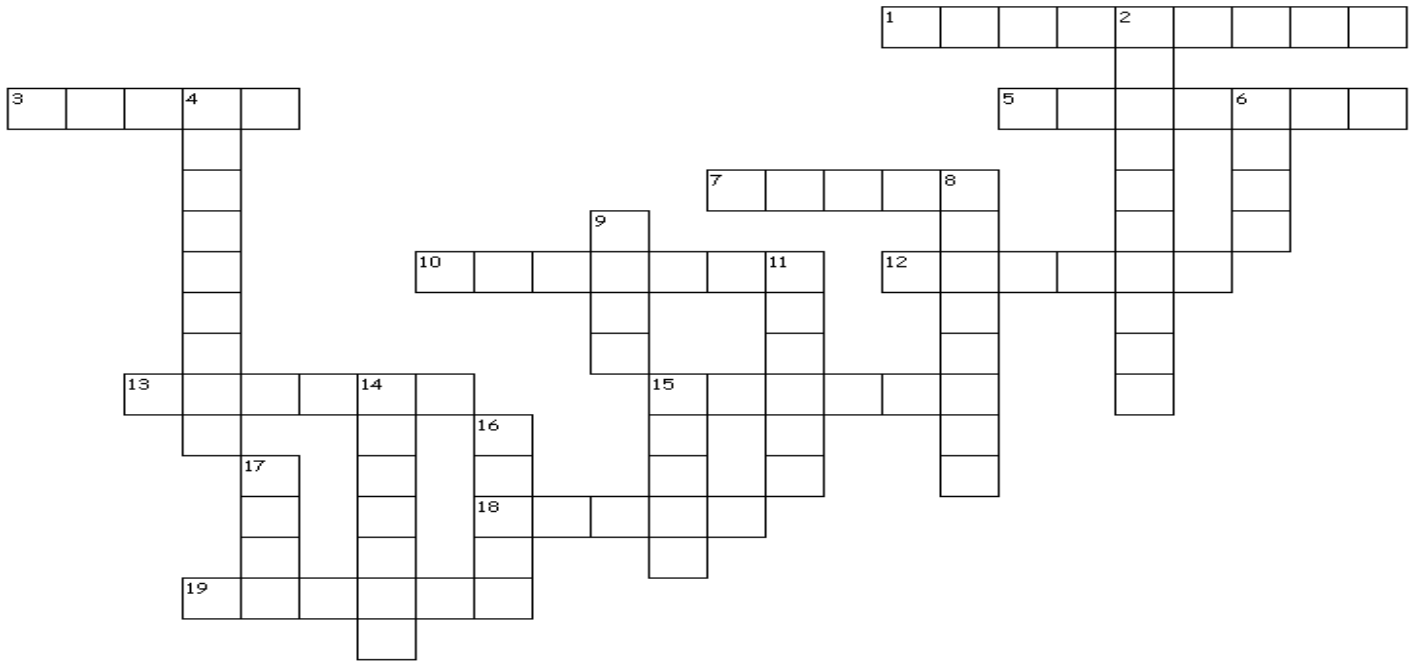


# Hot Western Maryland History!
