

What you should know about road closures & event viewing

Hosting the Individual Time Trial for America's largest cycling event is an exciting opportunity for our community. Please be aware of traffic impacts along the race course and on nearby roadways and plan your day accordingly. The race starts and ends in the Historic District, and thousands of cycling enthusiasts are expected to gather there.

Race Times -- Monday, May 12

- Amateurs 10 a.m. (50 riders, one-minute interval starts)
- Professional Women 11:10 a.m. (20 riders, one-minute interval starts)
- Professional Men 1:05 p.m. (128 riders, one-minute interval starts)

Road Closures - 9 a.m. - 4:30 p.m. Monday, May 12

- Rainbow Bridge and Folsom Lake Crossing closed
- ➤ Lake Natoma Crossing limited to one lane per direction
- Folsom-Auburn Rd limited to one southbound lane (no northbound traffic)
- ➤ East Natoma St closed between Folsom Lake Crossing and Blue Ravine
- Green Valley Rd closed between the County line and East Natoma St
- Riley St closed between Sutter St and Leidesdorff St in the Historic District



Event Parking

If you choose to view the race and attend festivities in the Historic District, you may park and walk or ride your bike from the following parking areas. *Park in legal parking stalls and designated parking areas only*. (Bike valet parking will be offered near the start/finish points.)

- ➤ Walmart, Kohl's and Lembi Park on Riley St
- Negro Bar State Park on Greenback Lane (\$5 fee helps support California State Parks)
- Folsom Civic Center (City Hall, Library, Rodeo Arena)
- On-street parking on public streets south of Natoma St (park legally and be considerate of residents and businesses)
- Please Note: Event parking will NOT be allowed on Historic District residential streets between Natoma and Figueroa. Parking enforcement will occur on race day.

Light Rail -- You may also take light rail directly to Historic Folsom from the Glenn, Iron Point or Hazel stations.

Other Viewing Sites -- If you prefer to avoid the large crowd in the Historic District, you may watch the cyclists from many points along the course. Walk or ride your bike to Folsom Auburn Road, Folsom Lake Crossing, Lake Natoma Crossing, East Natoma Street and Green Valley Road. Given the staggered starts, you will see a near steady flow of cyclists racing at speeds up to 30 miles per hour. *Please remember that safe conduct is critical for spectators and riders*. Be alert and enjoy the experience.
