Cardozo Senior High School is a LEED Gold project located on 1200 Clifton Street NW Washington, DC. This public high school renovation only allotted an 8-month window to furnish and install over 200 pieces of mechanical equipment including associated controls, piping, ductwork and accessories. The mechanical system include a condenser water system with water source heat pumps servicing the classrooms, atriums and common areas.

As you enter the school a mural of the clergyman, politician and educator, Mr. Francis Lewis Cardozo can be found. The school is home of the new Academy of Construction & Design. These classrooms provide students with a gateway to full-time employment and advanced placements as registered apprentices with construction firms. Capable students who excel at hands-on learning or who want to do applied work after graduation benefit from the Academy's well-designed vocational education program. Upon graduation, students are prepared to enter apprenticeship training programs sponsored by local builder associations or by local union-management committees, or to pursue two or four-year college programs. Most importantly, the academy creates a pool of applicants who are trained in specific trades to address the shortage of industry workers in the Washington metropolitan area.
