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We know the heroic efforts of our nation's fire service aren't limited to responding to emergencies. They are also busy presenting fire prevention education information to local schools and other community groups to make sure people know how to respond to fires and how to prevent them in the first place.

The Life Safety Achievement Award established in 1994 was created to both honor and inspire our country's fire departments in their fight to reduce fire fatalities through fire prevention education. Over the years, award recipients have led many creative and effective prevention programs. Most important, together we've saved lives.

The application period for the national Life Safety Achievement Award opens on Thursday, May 1, to recognize fire departments for their efforts in 2013. The award criteria and application will be available on the NASFM website firemarshals.org or on Grinnell Mutual Reinsurance Company's website at grinnellmutual.com next week. VEHICLE ARSON AWARENESS

According to the National Center for the Analysis of Violent Crime, the most common motive (41%) for an arsonist is revenge. An arsonist will target the home of someone in retaliation for an actual or perceived injustice against him or her. A car is viewed as an extension of the individual and is a very personal target for revenge arson.

Other common motives for vehicle arson include:

- ▶ Concealing another crime
- ▶ Curiosity
- ▶ Excitement
- ▶ Insurance fraud/Arson for profit
- ▶ Vandalism


