TEAMS

Ideally, each team should have between five and eight Scouts. Teams with fewer than five members will probably have a real problem making it around the trail, and may have trouble performing some of the events. Teams of more than eight are okay.

SLEDS

Sleds must be at least six feet long and at least 1-1/2 feet wide. There is no weight requirement for the sled, but it must be sturdy enough to carry the equipment listed below around the course. WHEELS ARE NOT ALLOWED!

TEAM EQUIPMENT NEEDED FOR THE KLONDIKE TRAIL

Trail lunch, drinking water, and rain gear for each Scout
Nugget pouch, marked with team name and troop number
Pencil or pen and paper
Blanket
Four sturdy staves, at least 5 feet long
Eight 8-foot ropes, about ¼ inch diameter
Compass
Simulated first aid kit (for events)

2 or 3 "sterile dressings"

7 or 8 cravats or triangular bandages
Complete tent (any kind is acceptable)
Plastic sheet, about 8 by 10 feet
Frying pan and spatula (and a plastic bag to put it in)

MEALS

Enough tender and firewood to cook a pancake

Matchless fire building material

Units are responsible for all meals. As noted above, lunch on Saturday should be a trail lunch. There will be a cracker barrel for Scoutmasters and Senior Patrol Leaders Friday evening and a camp-wide cracker barrel on Saturday evening (see the schedule for times). Troops may, of course, have their own cracker barrels.

SCORING

"Gold nuggets" will be awarded for successful completion of events at manned stations. Some stations are not manned, and teams will write their answers for these stations on a score sheet they will be given at the starting event. Maximum score at each station is 10 "nuggets". No additional "nuggets" will be awarded for Scout spirit...Scouts are expected to show Scout spirit! Teams can LOSE "nuggets" if the judge at a station thinks they don't show it! A word of caution: teams may be fined up to 10 "nuggets" for "environmental impact" if they show up at the end of the trail with a wrecked sled or lost equipment!

During the Klondike Gold Rush of 1897-1898, prospectors raced across Canada's Yukon Territory in search of gold. Those hearty adventurers carried their supplies on sleds pulled by dogs (if they were lucky), or more often, by themselves! The Klondike Derby recreates the strenuous activity of those Gold Rush days. It is a trail event, with each team of Scouts pulling its homemade sled around a 2-mile course, stopping at about two dozen stations along the way to earn "gold nuggets" by solving problems using the following skills:

Fire building (Second Class)
Fire building without matches
First Aid (Tenderfoot, Second Class, First Class)
Knots (Tenderfoot, First Class)
Lashings (First Class)
Map and compass (Second Class)
Directions without a compass (First Class)
Wild animals (Second Class)
Native plants (First Class)
Estimate height and width (First Class)
