A Story to Tell

On June 3, I had the privilege of launching my new book, the memoir *A Quarter Inch from My Heart*, at my home-away-fromhome for 15 years, Middle Church. On that humid evening, about 60 people showed up to help me celebrate.

This book is very much fully from my heart, and it's a story in which Middle Church plays a central role. Anyone who was here from 2005–2008 may know part of the story: I took in a near-stranger named Maurice after he arrived on my doorstep a month or so after Hurricane Katrina. While I invited him to stay with me until he "got back on his feet," that never happened and he remained my roommate and friend until a late-coming AIDS diagnosis took him from this world in early 2008.

It turned out that whatever Maurice may have experienced during Hurricane Katrina was just the beginning of his problems. And taking him in was the beginning of a lot of life lessons for me as well. While I felt led to do such a thing by my faith (even many faith-based people would say it was a pretty crazy thing to do!), the road to his and my spiritual recovering during that time was anything but easy. And yet, I never felt so engaged with my faith, so keyed in to what love and "radical welcome" really meant.

I was thrilled that Jacqui Lewis was able to interview me as part of the book launch. She was an integral, strong presence in helping me navigate the troubled—but also healing—waters with Maurice. Jacqui, having been there, was able to ask relevant and probing questions about the aftermath of the time with Maurice, and the creation of the book.

In fact, the entire Middle family wrapped its arms around me during that time, and also helped Maurice discover and display the beautiful heart within him before he passed away.

"Radical welcome" perhaps does not require us to do what I did in this case, something that was very much for my own benefit as well as his. It does require us to be sensitive to those around us and extend a smile, a handshake, or a hug, without preconditions.

We all have a story to tell. I am thankful that Middle has been such a big part of mine, and that Middle helped me to tell it in such a beautiful, meaningful way.

Pride Month Celebrated

Gay or straight, single or partnered, families or teenagers, we marched. Our feet strode down Fifth Avenue with a little dance in our step as our gospel choir sang Pharrell Williams' "Happy" and "Let Your Little Light Shine" from our float to the ecstatic crowds lining the parade route of New York City's annual Heritage of Pride March. Through your volunteering and resources, Middle Church reminded our city that each of us are made in God's image. The theology of "Love. Period." drove into our streets offering a message that has the potential to heal and transform others.

At Middle Church we organize, preach, and march for LGBT justice all through the year. But during June, there is a bit more glitter near our eyes and joy in our step. In addition to the March, our congregation marked Pride with the following events:

- Chad Tanaka Pack and Alisa Joyce attended a rally for LGBT Homeless Youth held by The National Coalition for the Homeless and the Ali Forney Center in New York City on June 2.
- Middle Member and Broadway choreographer Mark Dendy created a dance to Pharrell Willliams' "Happy" that was performed in worship on June 8. - Senior Minister Jacqui Lewis spoke on a panel at Jim Wallis' *Sojourners* Summit on June 20 in Washington, D.C. about why the church must work for LGBT justice.
- Minster Chad Tanaka Pack testified at the New York State Senate and Assembly Public Forum on legislation to ban mental health professionals from "conversion therapy" for gay minors.
- We partnered with Intersections' Believe Out Loud for our worship celebration with Bob Chase, Fred Johnson, Jacqui Lewis and the Middle Church Choir on June 22. And we collaborated with our sister Collegiate congregations for citywide events celebrating Pride.

Because of your energy and your donations, our children will know God embraces each of us and celebrates our sexualities.

When we return to our building, it will feel familiar, yet transformed. One big change? We will have an elevator, so everyone can really come in the door exactly as they are. Your amazing support in time, talent, and treasure makes our ministry happen. Together, our partnership is transformational!
