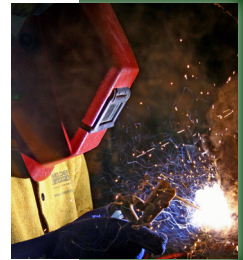

What is an Advisory Committee?

Advisory committees promote greater cooperation between the Pima County JTED’s programs and career and technical education (CTE) and the business community.

They’re made up primarily of private-sector members who volunteer their time, talent and knowledge to support and strengthen CTE programs.

Advisory committees have three major roles:

- ➔ To advise
- ➔ To assist
- ➔ To support and advocate for CTE

Committee members also assist educators in identifying job specific skills so that instruction will better reflect the needs of business and industry.

How do the committees function?

Committees enhance the Pima County JTED’s programs by providing guidance through the following areas:

- ➔ Recruitment and Job Placement
- ➔ Career & Technical Student Organizations
