## GENERAL INFORMATION

### Statement of Need

Cardiovascular (CV) disease is the leading health care problem throughout the world. In the United States alone, an estimated 70 million people have been diagnosed with one or more forms of CV disease, and over 910,000 Americans die from CV disease each year. This activity will provide information for the cardiac care team to develop methods to work more efficiently while providing quality patient care.

### Overall Goal

The overall goal of this program is to focus on achieving optimal patient outcomes and the performance of the healthcare provider by increasing learner competence in the areas of new interventional technologies, pharmacology, health care reform, lipid guidelines, imaging, risk stratification of post MI patients at risk for sudden cardiac death, and medicolegal issues.

### Learner Objectives

Upon completion of this program, participants should be able to:

- Discuss the efficacy of left atrial occlusion devices and appropriately refer atrial fibrillation patients for this treatment option.
- Determine optimal threshold for initiating treatment in patients with hypertension and establish evidence based treatment goals for patients with hypertension.
- Discuss the newest pharmacological agents for the cardiovascular patient.
- Recognize the impact of Health Care Reform legislation on the practice of cardiology.
- Review the literature and guidelines on the use of statin therapy.
- Discuss the appropriate selection and use of cardiac CT and MRI imaging in patients with cardiac disease.
- Compare and contrast strategies for risk stratification and management of patients post MI at risk for sudden death.
- Evaluate medicolegal risk reduction in the management of cardiac patients.
