Some of the best ways to become acquainted with Boston is to take the Freedom Trail walking tour exploring the historic sights of Paul Revere's house, Faneuil Hall, and John Hancock's grave, other tours include the Boston Duck's World War II-style amphibious vehicles to see the State House, Bunker Hill, and Newbury Street, then by sea, you'll get a picture-perfect view of Boston and Cambridge from the Charles River.

Other must see venues include; New England Aquarium, Museum of Science, the Mapparium a three-story stain glass globe constructed in 1935 which tracks global shifts over the past century, Fenway Park home of the Red Sox, the oldest major league baseball field, and a Harbor Island cruise to view over 30 islands with a stop at Fort Warren, a Civil War-era fort.
