On September 1, 2014, Harvey P. Barton, Jr., entered the church triumphant after a courageous battle with cancer. Harvey grew up in Nitro, West Virginia, and graduated from Nitro High School in 1963. He attended West Virginia University and was graduated from its School of Pharmacy in 1969. After graduation, he settled in the Huntington, West Virginia, area where he worked as a hospital pharmacist. He later came up with an idea to start his own home health care business--and Option Care was born. His business grew and later came to be known as Comprecare. He treated his business as a blessing from God. He shared that blessing by creating employment opportunities for others and sharing his wealth to help further Christ's Kingdom here on earth. Whether it was with his time, talents or treasures, he was always a cheerful giver—and he never held back.
