



## <u>Learn to navigate Stanford's first roundabout on</u> Campus Drive at Escondido Road

Stanford's first intersection conversion to a single-lane roundabout is currently under construction at Escondido Road and Campus Drive and is expected to be completed in September. This new roundabout will enable more efficient vehicular circulation and reduce confusion for drivers, cyclists and pedestrians. Instead of requiring vehicles to come to a complete stop and determine who has the right of way, vehicles and bicycles should now be able to flow in a slow but continuous and safe manner to their destinations. Details on how to navigate a roundabout are provided below for each specific mode. *Please be aware that bicycles and vehicles will share the road in the roundabout.* 

## Vehicles:

- Slow when approaching.
- Look for and yield to pedestrians crossing before you reach the roundabout.
- Yield to traffic in the roundabout, including bicyclists:
  - If clear, enter slowly without stopping.
  - If there are oncoming cyclists or vehicles in the roundabout, slow or stop until it's clear to enter.
- Proceed slowly and with caution when safe.

## Cyclists:

- Ride in the roundabout as a vehicle.
  - Look for and yield to pedestrians crossing before you reach the roundabout
  - Yield to vehicles already in the roundabout.
- Alternatively, walk your bike (never ride) in the crosswalk.

## Pedestrians:

- Cross only at crosswalks.
- Watch for vehicles and bicyclists.
- Refrain from distractions, such as texting, when crossing.
- Proceed only when traffic is clear or stopped.
