Over the last few decades the twin population has increased by more than 75% and today approximately one in every 30 births is a twin. Twins are no longer rare. In the past, twins have usually been treated as typical brothers or sisters, yet the relationship is so much more. With in-depth understanding of the twin bond, professionals can have an edge on producing excellent clinical outcomes when working with twins on any concern and two specific challenges will receive focused attention during the presentation.
