Type of work: Homeless ministry, ministry to the dying, inner-city schools

Spring Break:

1. Dominican Republic

Dates: Saturday, March 14 - Saturday, March 21 Type of work: Construction, coffee planting Note: at this site, students stay with host families

2. Guatemala

Dates: Saturday, March 14 - Saturday, March 21 Type of work: Construction, coffee, gardening

3. Jamaica

Dates: Saturday, March 14 - Saturday, March 21

Types of work: Ministry to the elderly, homeless, people with Leprosy

4. Nicaragua

Dates: Saturday, March 14 - Saturday, March 21

Type of work: Construction, water/sanitation projects

3. West Virginia

Dates: Sunday, March 15 - Saturday, March 21

Type of work: community garden, clothes closet, community outreach, day care

<u>Prayer and Reflection</u>: as a Jesuit University, prayer/reflection is an integral aspect of our service-immersion trips.

Pre-Trip Reflection

- One large group service trip gathering
- > Two to three small group meetings with each travel group

Mid-Trip Reflection

- Morning prayer
- Evening reflection

Post-Trip Reflection

- One large group service trip gathering
- One small group trip reunion

Student Leader Positions:

- Video: Students in this position will make a video (using photos, video, music) using pictures and videos from all the trips for use on the Rockhurst website and at meetings to promote the trips.

- You want to honor the people with whom we lived and served during the trip.

Application process:

- 1. Access the application at Campus Ministry's website.
- 2. Discern what you want to say in your essay, for what student leader position (if any) you would like to apply, your trip rankings, etc.
- 3. Complete the application.
- 4. Proceed to Susan Janet's desk (Massman 1) to sign up for an interview.

Dates:

- > Application/Interview Sign-Up Due Date: Friday, October 3rd
- ➤ Interview Dates: October 13—17
- > Notification Date: October 31

<u>Evaluation process</u>: all full-time (both fall and spring semester) Rockhurst Students are eligible to apply for the service trips. The following criteria are used to evaluate/rank applicants:

- University discipline file
- University accounts
- Quality of application essay

- Academics

- Seniority

o November 3: <u>non-refundable</u> \$200 deposit due

o December 5: <u>non-refundable</u> balance due

Spring Break Trips

o December 5: <u>non-refundable</u> \$200 deposit due

o February 13: non-refundable balance due

<u>Scholarship</u>: All students who are accepted to a service trip receive a scholarship in the sense that Rockhurst University pays for approximately half of all students' expenses. No other scholarships are available.

<u>Discernment</u>: Service-Immersion Trips cost Rockhurst University more than \$100,000 each year. This money, if simply sent as a donation, could do much good in Central America and in depressed areas of our own country. As you discern your application to the trips, please ask yourself: what will I do, especially <u>after</u> my trip, to ensure that the money spent on sending me on a service-immersion trip will serve the poor better than simply sending the money down as a donation?
