

Many see band as a class on learning to play an instrument, but we know it is much more than that. It is also the development of a family of friends which will last a lifetime. Studies show it is establishment of rather profound influences which will determine much of your child's success in ALL aspects of education, not just band.

At St. Teresa band is taught as an educational enrichment class and, secondly, as an activity. It is a class because there is a certain body of knowledge to be acquired and a level of skill to be attained by all participants. Band becomes an activity because not everyone is required to play an instrument. To acquire instrumental knowledge and skill, one needs a good Christian work ethic and a focused attitude toward learning their assigned parts.



Families considering the cost, time, and effort needed to provide instrumental musical instruction should consider these benefits:

- Playing a musical instrument can give a child much satisfaction and sense of accomplishment.
- People who play an instrument tend to be quick thinkers. The faster the pace of our world becomes, the more important quick thinking becomes a highly prized work skill.
- ▲ An easily clarified concept clearly shows that students' grades generally go up after a few months of musical instruction. Not every child can excel at sports, just as not all will excel at music, but this remains the beauty of musical instruction...a child does not have to excel in order to still participate and enjoy the experience. This becomes a truly "Win-Win" situation.
- And, most importantly, numerous studies have shown students who take lessons on an instrument stimulate their brains in a unique way. By learning to play an instrument, students' academic skills and performance in math, language arts, foreign language, science, and other academic areas are enhanced. Even standardized test scores such as SAT are higher among musicians.

In conclusion....whatever the reason, playing an instrument can bring joy and fulfillment in ways that only band can. Always remember, at St. Teresa School
