

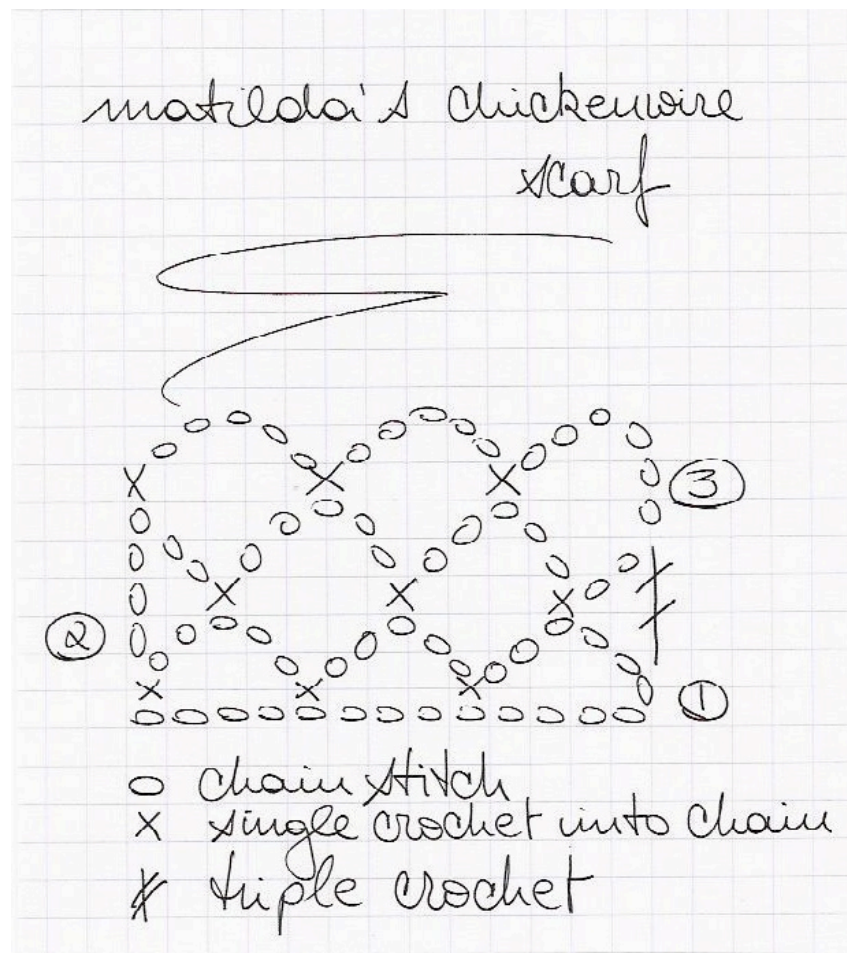


# Tante Sophie await un chien

Matilda's crochet chickenwire scarf ... magical ... wispy ... airy ... fuzzy ... warm ... not too warm ... just right ... and who would have thought chickenwire would be so versatile. Who's Matilda you may ask ... she's the chicken herding dog that read about Alchemy Yarns Kozmos on Knitter's Review and thought she'd want some for herself! The scarf is about 5 inches wide and 128 inches long when laid out flat. When draped around the neck it collapses on itself and might seem less wide. Given the length achieved here you could actually decide to make two shorter scarves, keeping one for yourself and gifting the other.

1. One skein Alchemy Yarns Kozmos. The color used here is either Scarlett's Dark Secret or Bordeaux ... Matilda can't remember!
2. A bamboo crochet hook ... 8.0 mm ... that's a nice chunky one! You could probably wiggle it with one size smaller or larger. It is not absolutely crucial to get gauge here. This is a fun and quick project, airy and loopy!
3. A chibi darning needle to put away the ends.
4. This is an easy chain stitch pattern where the loops anchor onto the ones from the previous row.
5. The pattern is a stitch number divisible by 4+1, four plus one.
6. Make a slip knot. CH (chain) 19 sts (three times four plus one plus six ... it will make sense when you take a peek at the schematic for this). Turn.
7. SC (single crochet) into the 11<sup>th</sup> stitch from the hook. Look for ① in the chart on the right edge.
8. (CH 5, skip 3 CH, SC into the 4<sup>th</sup> CH)\* ... repeat \* once more. Turn.

9. Look for ② in the chart on the left edge. CH 6, (SC into the top of the CH 5 (that's the 3<sup>rd</sup> chain stitch) of the previous row, CH 5)\* ... repeat \* once more, CH 2, TC (triple crochet) into the top of the turning chain stitch of the previous row. Turn.
10. Look for ③ in the chart on the right edge. CH 6, (SC into the top of the CH 5 of the previous row, CH 5)\* ... repeat \* once more, CH 5, skip 2 CH, SC into the 3<sup>rd</sup> CH. Turn.
11. Repeat steps 8 and 9 until you have reached the desired length.
12. If you would rather have a wider scarf work with the numbers to get what you want. It's always divisible by 4+1!
13. Here is a scan of the stitch pattern that should make it much easier to follow along.
14. With the 10.0 mm hook and Cascade Covington chain 27 sts and proceed. You will have 5 repeats in the first row.
