### A Camp for Grieving Children

#### **CAMP OBJECTIVES**

Wings is a weekend camping experience for children, ages 8 - 16, who have had a significant person to die. Campers learn that they are not alone in their grief and that their feelings are normal. They learn how to deal with feelings of grief and how to face anxieties concerning the ways their lives have changed. Children begin to see that grief is not a process of forgetting, but rather, a process of remembering with less pain.

Wings participants will have an opportunity to:

- Make new friends with others who have also experienced a loss
- Find creative ways to express their feelings
- Experience comfort and encouragement from peers
- Have some fun and laughter

### SUGGESTIONS FOR HELPING A CHILD WORK THROUGH GRIEF

- Be present
- Be patient
- Listen, Listen, Listen
- Accept all expressions of grief
- Give time for children to talk about the loved one who has died

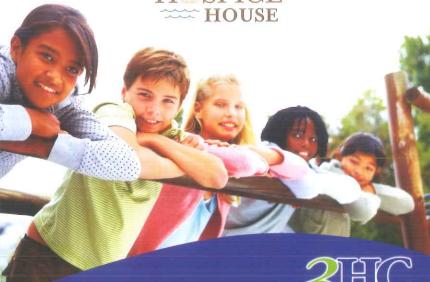

#### THE GRIEF EXPERIENCE

Everyone deals with grief in a different way and a child is no exception. Because of their limited experiences and lack of coping skills, children may find the grief process

very difficult.





Hospice of 3HC sponsors Wings with a goal of helping children find support from other children who have experienced similar losses. Along with the camp experience, Wings offers recreational programming with an emphasis on bereavement. Grief-

related activities are conducted in small groups led

by camp volunteers. Children are encouraged to express themselves through arts and crafts.

#### A POSITIVE STEP

Wings is a place where children learn, in a safe and caring environment, that their feelings are normal and an important part of the healing process. 3HC

staff and volunteers supervise the camp. They are specially trained to work with children who have lost loved ones. All volunteers attend a pre-camp training session.

Wings will be a positive step for children as they explore and find expression for the grief they are experiencing.
