How does the Rotary HealthRays: Guatemala project work?

Rotary, working with its partner organizations, purchases digital x-ray units, which are installed in remote clinics that serve the poor. Digital x-ray images are sent from the

What are the potential benefits of the project?

District 6440 estimates that the HealthRays project could eventually impact more than one and a half million people in Guatemala. In addition, it will benefit Guatemala's economy by creating new jobs at the 29 remote clinics. It will improve the long-term health and work productivity of Guatemalans through better access to medical care.

Why is partnership important?

This project has been launched using Rotary International's new funding structure. It is based on a memorandum of understanding between Rotary and major public and private sector organizations in the region, including the Guatemalan government and two leading health care

organizations. The contribution of both Rotary and non-Rotary partners is critical to the success of the HealthRays project.

What is the long term goal for Rotary HealthRays: Guatemala?


