
Foundation Studies

Rudolf Steiner was born in the small village of Kraljevec, Austria (now in Croatia) in 1861 and died in Dornach, Switzerland in 1925.



chemistry. Having written his thesis on philosophy, Steiner earned his doctorate and was later drawn into literary and scholarly circles and participated in the rich social and political life of Vienna.

The Waldorf school movement originated with a school Steiner developed for the children of factory employees at the Waldorf-Astoria cigarette factory. Today, Waldorf schools are all over the world. There are homes, schools and village communities for children and adults with special needs. Biodynamic agriculture began with a course of lectures requested by a group of farmers concerned about the destructive trend of "scientific" farming. Steiner's work with doctors led to a medical movement that includes clinics, hospitals and various forms of therapeutic work. As an art of movement, eurythmy also serves educational and therapeutic work.

Foundation Studies

Waldorf School of Orange County's program of Foundation Studies is a twoyear program which will enable participants to

continue for a further two years with the WSOC Teacher Training Program, if desired. Courses in Anthroposophy and Waldorf Education are the two main areas of study, supported by intense artistic work. Some further courses will include a Biography workshop, an Early Childhood workshop, Dante's Divine Comedy, the Development of Consciousness through Literature, the History of Music, Parzival and others.

The program, which began in 2009, is directed by Chris Bennett, who joined the faculty of WSOC in September 2009 and is the former Director of Kula Makua Adult Waldorf Education in Honolulu, and was an instructor at the London Waldorf Teacher Training Seminar (UK) for many years before that. Faculty members from WSOC will be supporting this program in addition to guest teachers from the wider Anthroposophical movement.

The First Year

The first year program will include:

Child Development and the Basics of Waldorf

Education. This class will be centered around the study of two of Rudolf Steiner's basic books on Waldorf Education: The Education of the Child and The Kingdom of Childhood, with a detailed look at child development and wide-ranging discussions of the various themes and topics arising.

Theosophy (by Rudolf Steiner), the study of the human being in relation to the cosmos from an Anthroposophical perspective.

Artistic Activities will include a combination of several of the following activities: singing, eurythmy, speech, black and white drawing, painting, form drawing, handwork, modeling and projective geometry.

A Biography Workshop, with Lee Sturgeon Day on October 5 and 6, 2012: a look at the cycles and rhythms of one's life from a spiritual point of view.

A Painting Workshop with Angelika Kolbe,

May 15-16: Watercolor painting exploring the wet-onwet technique used in the grades. Angelika is a very experienced class teacher and art teacher, as well as an artist in her own right.
