Update on the Rudolf Steiner Library

In December of 2013, the Rudolf Steiner Library began the process of moving from its home of 32 years on Fern Hill, in Harlemville, NY, to a new location four miles down the road in Philmont, NY. The Steiner Library is the largest single collection of anthroposophical materials in the English language in the world. The library, grown in great part by the late Fred Paddock, holds over 36,000 books, journals, and manuscript items dating back to the 1920s. 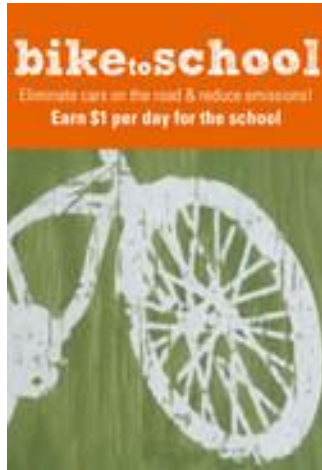
Waldorf Alum in the Winter Olympics
