Pastor Bill's Message

Herod secretly called for the wise men and learned from them the exact time when the star had appeared. Then he sent them to Bethlehem, saying, "Go and search diligently for the child; and when you have found him, bring me word so that I may also go and pay him homage." When they had heard the king, they set out; and there, ahead of them, went the star that they had seen at its rising, until it stopped over the place where the child was. When they saw that the star had stopped, they were overwhelmed with joy. On entering the house, they saw the child with Mary his mother; and they knelt down and paid him homage. Then, opening their treasure chests, they offered him gifts of gold, frankincense, and myrrh. And having been warned in a dream not to return to Herod, they left for their own country by another road.

Dear Friends,

A couple of nights before Epiphany, I found myself, as I often do, gazing at the stars. I was alone on that dark night; and, I was wishing that I owned a telescope. Because it was a new moon, the lunar light was minimal. As a result, the stars were absolutely, and breathtakingly, beautiful. Normally, we can't see the stars very well because they aren't bright enough. What a telescope does (in addition to magnification) is gather the faint light of a distant star and concentrate that light to the eye. It makes that star bright enough to be seen. In other words, a wider opening is needed to see beyond the limits of human sight.

That is true in the field of astronomy. That is true in the life of faith. That is true for those who seek an experience of holy mystery—a wider opening is needed to see beyond the limits of human sight.

The wise sages of whom the Bible gives witness were led by a star to a place of overwhelming joy and thanksgiving. Yet, as the story is told, their journey began with Herod's ominous and deceptive request that they go and find the child and then bring him word of his whereabouts. Danger accompanied the wise sages on their way. They had much to consider as they journeyed. They even returned home by a different way...perhaps, as when they came, under the direction and cover of night. I picture them walking in shadows trusting that the path would open up before them—under the light of the star.

As we move into a new year, we also trust that the path will open before us as we continue the journey—that in our desire to seek a more profound relationship with God, with each other, and with humanity in general—we will also open ourselves wider to opportunities of faith. We will open ourselves wider to compassion, kindness, and justice; wider to risk, new opportunities and ever-expanding dimensions of spiritual growth; and, wider to what it means to be people of faith who take their spiritual journey both seriously and joyfully.

May the light of Christ's natal star lead us in the New Year to places of joy and inspiration—as we continue to open ourselves to God's grace, love and hope for something new, and for something more.



BOEHM'S PASTORS

1796 THROUGH 1799

As the 275th Anniversary approaches in 2015, the History Corner will begin giving information about the Pastors who have served at Boehm's since it was established in 1740.



1796-1799

Rev. Samuel Helfenstein, Sr., D.D. became pastor in 1796 (His last name is spelled in different ways in old records, often with two f's) until February 1799. He was said to have been a very energetic young man, good scholar and a man of considerable talents. However, he left to accept the pastorate of the Race Street Church upon the death of Rev. Hendel on Sept. 29, 1798 – on one week's notice. Hendel had been Helfenstein's teacher when he was studying for the ministry.

Rev. Frederick Herman was a supply pastor for an unknown amount of time. He signed a pay receipt dated May 19, 1799.

For everything a season...

Wanting his sons to learn not to judge too quickly, a man sent each, in turn, on a quest to look at a pear tree far away and report what he saw. The first son went in winter, the second in spring, the third in summer and the fourth in fall. Finally, the father gathered the young men together. "What did you see?" he asked.



The first son reported seeing an ugly tree, bent and lifeless. The second disagreed, saying it was budding with fresh new life. The third son reported finding a tree laden with sweet-smelling, beautiful blossoms, while the fourth insisted it drooped with ripe fruit.

The father said his sons were all correct, for they'd seen the same tree, though at different seasons of its life. "Don't judge a tree — or a person — based on just one season of life," he counseled his children. "Who they are can only be known at the end, when all life's seasons have been lived.

"Furthermore," he added, "don't give up on your own life if you experience a hard season, such as winter, or you'll miss out on the renewal of spring, the joy of summer, the fulfillment of autumn."



PRESENT: Pastor Middleton, Gary Rau, Diana Rau, Albert Slingluff, Traci Law, Pat Delp, Judy Keller, Carol Palmer and Anita Law.

LOGO FOR BOEHMS: This will be discussed at the next meeting as Linda Moore is working on this and is unable to attend today's meeting.

NEW REGISTRY BOOK: A new Registry Book was presented by Diana and Gary and will replace the current one in the Narthex. The new one includes a place for an e-mail address.

REVIEW OF WELCOME PACKET FOR VISITORS: Recommendations were made and it was approved that the Welcome Packet will contain a plastic bag with the Church's info on it and the saying in the bulletin, a folder which will hold a pamphlet about the church ministries, a pamphlet about the history of the church, a letter from the Pastor with an invitation to return next week, a visitor card and a church business card, a current church newsletter. The business card will contain the church logo, general church info, web site, twitter and Facebook accounts and other pertinent information. It is anticipated that at least some of the above will be fully completed by January.

FOLLOW UP FOR VISITORS: When a member of the committee notices a visitor a welcome packet will be given out to the visitor. The committee reviewed and approved an e-mail presented by Traci and a postcard to be sent to visitors. Pastor and Traci will set up an information address to be used. Anita reported that she had spoken to Carol Pfister who is willing to check the Registry Book each week and send the e-mail approved by the committee to the visitor. She will also e-mail Anita with the information. Anita will then mail the approved postcard to the visitor with a thank you for visiting note on it.

WEBSITE ACCESS: No new updates.

TWITTER ACCESS: No new updates.

FACEBOOK ACCESS: Pastor noted that there is a "Boehm's Church of Chris" Facebook page which needs to be closed. Anita and Traci will look into it to determine who is the administrator of the site and contact the appropriate person. It was noted that it may have been set up by Dan Warner when he was working with the initial church website.

OTHER ADVERTISING: No new updates.

CHURCH NEWSLETTER: No new updates.

PROPOSAL FOR ART GALLERY/SHOWS: No new updates as nothing can be done until approval of finances for the WHEE Committee at the Congregational Meeting scheduled for December 8th. A question was raised concerning the Baptist Church which is renting fellowship Hall as to whether they would have any objection to a photo gallery. Pastor indicated he had already spoken about this possibility to the Pastor of the Baptist Church and does not anticipate any problems.

HANDICAP ACCESS BATHROOM: After a brief discussion it was determined that even though the bathroom outside of Fellowship Hall cannot yet be made Handicap Accessible it would help members of the congregation as well as visitors to immediate change it to a Unisex Bathroom. This will eliminate the need for men to go up the flight of steps to use a

men's room. Pastor will ask Carol Pfister to order the appropriate sign from Staples. Gary volunteered to hang the sign and put a latch to lock the door inside the bathroom. It is hoped that this can be completed before the Lasagna dinner in December.

MOVIE NIGHTS: Traci reported that a movie night has been planned for February 14, 2014. At that time a showing of the original Dracula movie will be shown and a cemetery tour including the gravesite of one of the actors buried at Boehm's will be offered.

OLD BUSINESS: Traci reported she has held two paranormal investigations at Boehm's in the last month. The first one raised \$90.00 for Boehm's. The second one raised \$220.00 for Boehm's. This money will be deposited into the WHEE account pending approval of the account at the Dec. 8th Congregational Meeting. She noted that an additional \$10.00 will be given for deposit into the History Group's account as History Group merchandise was sold at the events.

After a brief discussion it was noted that the formation of a memory and on-going fundraising plaque to be set up in Fellowship Hall as discussed at the October meeting will remain under the WHEE Committee. Anita volunteered to get information on the wooden plaque as well as the brass plates pending approval of funds to be obtained for a checking account for WHEE at the December 8th Congregational Meeting.

NEW BUSINESS: Traci noted that heat will need to be turned on for some of the functions during the winter months. Anita has spoken to Glenn Palmer who will work with Traci to allow her to have the heat available. The Committee approved the above.

Traci noted that an acquaintance, John, who would like to use Boehm's as the site of an Exposition which he has annually in the area. It was noted that he does this professionally and has insurance coverage. Approval was given by the Committee pending approval at the November Consistory Meeting that the WHEE Committee can make decisions to approve and act upon recommendations made within the committee. Traci will follow through and notify John of the decision as he needs to know within the next week in order to start making arrangements.

NEXT MEETING: As there is no meeting in December the next meeting will be held on Sunday January 26, 2014 at 11:15 AM.
