

**MorseLife Dedicates Palm Beach County's Newest
Short-Term Rehabilitation Center
*100,000 Square Foot Center Named for Philanthropists Sondra and David S. Mack***

West Palm Beach, FL, March 28, 2014 – Amid shiny marble floors, expansive hallways and lush exteriors, MorseLife today dedicated Palm Beach County's newest short-term rehabilitation center – the Sondra and David S. Mack Pavilion – on the MorseLife campus on Haverhill Road. The 100,000 square foot, 120-bed Pavilion was built for \$30 million dollars with over \$22 million dollars raised to date through the generosity of donors to the nonprofit's Campaign to Transform MorseLife.

The Mack Pavilion, the newest building on the 37-acre suburban West Palm Beach campus, is named for Sondra and David S. Mack, who are lead donors for the organization's capital campaign and long-time supporters of MorseLife. "We are grateful to Sondra and David for their steadfast belief in our future – that of being a model of excellence in rehabilitation care for the benefit of the Palm Beach County community," noted Keith Myers, President/CEO of MorseLife. "Along with their leadership, we are most appreciative of Campaign Chairman Stephen Levin and the many generous donors who came forward with major gifts to support this broad-reaching initiative."

Myers describes The Mack Pavilion as a much-needed service to the Palm Beach County community. "Our vision over a year ago is a reality, as we are ready for the influx of seniors who require rehabilitation after hospitalization for heart attack, stroke, orthopedic injury or other debilitating conditions," noted Myers. "Our goal is to enable our patients to get back to their daily lives at home through a comprehensive plan for recovery."

The Mack Pavilion includes a 6,000 square foot therapy suite and the latest medical advancements and technology in rehabilitation care. "A patient-centered care model, the Pavilion offers luxury surroundings with six homelike 'neighborhoods' of 20 residents each, featuring private rooms and baths, dining room and lounging areas," he said. "The building also includes expansive terraces, gardens and other outdoor areas for relaxation, as well as a covered walkway with a fountain view." The architect for The Mack Pavilion is the firm of Perkins Eastman, the construction company is Whiting-Turner, the landscape architect is Nievera Williams and the interiors are by Smith Interior Design Group.

MorseLife is a 5-star quality ranked, Gold Seal Award skilled nursing and rehabilitation center and is designated by the Florida State Legislature as a "Teaching Nursing Home," one of two in the state. This makes MorseLife a coveted site for research and training of future physicians, nurses and allied health professionals.
