First Year Leader First Year	Each SU may elect to purchase these pins from our Shop for volunteers completing their first year as a troop leader. It is recommended that they be awarded at a Service Unit meeting or event in the spring.	□ Is an active, registered adult Girl Scout troop leader □ Has successfully completed their first year of service and all requirements for the position	The SU Recognitions Chair or Manager may purchase a pin for each volunteer within their SU who meets the criteria.
Outstanding New Leader "Green & Growing" Pin	Each SU may elect to purchase this pin to award to one or two exceptional new troop leader(s) each year. It is recommended that this pin be awarded at a SU meeting or event in the spring.	 □ Has completed their first year as a troop leader/coleader and has committed to serving a second year □ Has completed required trainings (in-person or online) □ Regularly attends service unit meetings or sends a troop representative □ Engages the girls in a variety of fun, interesting activities 	□ Any Girl Scout girl or adult may nominate their troop leader for this recognition. □ Print or email one Nomination form to the SU Recognitions Chair, along with a letter from a troop girl or parent explaining why their leader is deserving, by Feb 27, 2015.
Troop Product Sales Hero GSSN Shop Certificate	Each SU may elect to gift a GSSN Shop certificate in denominations starting at \$5 to an exceptional Product Sales Volunteer within the SU, following each Fall Product and Cookie Sale season.	 □ Has served for a minimum of three years as Troop Product Sales Coordinator (TPSC) □ Has exhibited up-to-date knowledge about either the fall or cookie product sale and serves informally as a support for other area TPSCs and volunteers □ Completes all duties correctly and on time 	□ Any troop leader or fellow SU volunteer may print or email a Nomination form to the SU Recognitions Chair, along with an explanation about this TPSC's helpfulness in their role.

Service Unit "Volunteer-of- the-Month" Lawn Sign or Peel-able Decal	Each SU may elect to purchase either of these items from the GSSN shop to recognize up to one volunteer a month who has recently exhibited exceptional volunteerism Each SU's "Volunteer-of-the-month" will be named and one will be "spotlighted" in our GSSN Essentials and Website throughout the year.	 □ Has completed all position-appropriate trainings □ Has contributed to the success of the SU in some capacity □ Serves as a role model for other volunteers 	 Any Girl Scout volunteer may nominate a fellow SU volunteer for this recognition. Complete one Nomination form with brief description of nominee's contribution, and email it, along with a digital photo, to the SU Recognitions Chair. The SU Recognitions Chair should choose their candidate, then email the name and photo of the volunteer selected each month to jmahon@gssn.org.

Years of Membership Numeral Guards	These numeral guards are awarded to volunteers based on their combined years as a registered girl and adult member of Girl Scouts. They are available in five-year increments.	□ Has been a registered active member of Girl Scouts (either as a girl or adult) for a combined total of 5, 10, 15, 20years.	 Any Girl Scout volunteer meeting the criteria may submit an online Nomination form by Feb 13, 2015 to be recognized at the council's Annual Meeting and Adult Recognitions Brunch on April 18.
Years of Service Pin	These pins are awarded to any Girl Scout volunteer who has served a minimum of five years as a volunteer. (The five years do not have to be in a single role or position.) These pins are available in five-year increments.	□ Has served as a registered Girl Scout volunteer for 5, 10,15, 20years.	 Any Girl Scout volunteer meeting the criteria may submit an online Nomination form by Feb 13, 2015 to be recognized at the council's Annual Meeting and Recognitions Brunch on April 18.

Volunteer of Excellence	The Volunteer of Excellence award recognizes those volunteers who have contributed outstanding service while partnering directly with girls in any pathway to implement the Girl Scout Leadership Experience (GSLE) through use of the National Program Portfolio or who have contributed outstanding service in support of the council's mission delivery to girl and adult members.	□ Is an active, registered adult Girl Scout. □ Has successfully completed a term of service and all requirements for the position. □ Has performed beyond expectations for the position to deliver the GSLE to girls using the National Program Portfolio, OR □ Performance has been beyond the expectations of the position and has supported the council's mission-delivery goals in one or more of the following functional areas: Membership Development/ Community Cultivation, Volunteer Relations and Support, Program, Leadership and Governance, Fund Development, and Council Support Service (such as IT, Merchandising). □ Actively recognizes, understands, and practices the values of inclusive behavior.	□ Any Girl Scout girl or adult may nominate an adult volunteer by submitting one Nomination form and one Endorsement form indicating how the nominee meets the criteria. □ Nominations and endorsements must be submitted by February 13, 2015. □ Board of Directors approves or denies nominations based on the recommendations of the Volunteer Recognitions Task Force
Appreciation Pin	The Appreciation Pin recognizes an individual's exemplary service in support of delivering the Girl Scout Leadership Experience (GSLE). This service, which has had measurable impact on one geographic area of service, helps the council reach and surpass its missiondelivery goals for that area.	□ The nominee is an active, registered adult Girl Scout. □ The service performed by the nominee is above and beyond the expectations for the position held, and made an impact on one or more geographic area within the council's jurisdiction.	□ Any Girl Scout may nominate an adult volunteer by submitting one Nomination form and one Endorsement form. □ Nominations and endorsements must be submitted by February 13, 2015 □ Board of Directors approves or denies nominations based on the recommendations of the Volunteer Recognitions Task Force
Honor Pin	The Honor Pin recognizes an individual's exemplary service in support of delivering the Girl Scout Leadership Experience (GSLE), which has had measurable impact on two or more geographic areas of service, allowing the council to reach and surpass its missiondelivery goals.	□ The nominee is an active, registered adult Girl Scout. □ The service performed by the nominee is above and beyond the expectations for the position held and made an impact on two or more geographic areas within the council's jurisdiction.	 □ Requires one Nomination form and one letter of Endorsement form □ Nominations and endorsements must be submitted by February 13, 2015. □ Board of Directors approves or denies nominations based on the recommendations of the Volunteer Recognitions Task Force.
