True Price

From concept to strategy

This year is focused on the resolve we made last year to make special efforts to focus on true price, the key to Rudolf Steiner's economics course, but also to his approach to the practical problems of today. To this theme he was constant and consistent from 1905 through to 1922. (There is now a webpage in true price on the Economics Conference website.) One of our concerns is whether the increasing suggestion of unconditional basic income is compatible with Steiner's approach. This movement is now gaining ground, especially in Switzerland, but is also to be found more and more in the media. Our concerns are not polemical, but deep-seated. In particular, if basic income were to become established would it in fact, albeit without intending to do so, close the door on true price, both as an idea and as a possible policy?

The meeting is open to anyone who takes in earnest the indications of Rudolf Steiner and the work of the School of Spiritual Science as regards modern economic life. It will again include an additional day (Wednesday, 25th June) focusing on associative economics in secondary schools. There will be an extra charge for this.
