## State of Schaumburg Address

Village President Al Larson delivered his "State of Schaumburg Address" at the Schaumburg Business Association's Good Morning Schaumburg event. President Larson takes this opportunity to discuss current community projects and other issues affecting the village.

President Larson noted that as we head into 2014, the financial stability of the village remains strong, as evidenced by AAA credit ratings from both Moody's Investors Service and Standard and Poor's. AAA-rated institutions are judged to be of the highest quality and subject to the lowest level of credit risk, as very few municipal governments receive AAA ratings. Being sensitive to the current economic climate, there were no tax increases imposed during 2013. The only significant increase in user charges was to water and sewer fees, which increased 12%; however, this was necessary due to the City of Chicago's 15% increase in the price charged for Lake Michigan water.

The Schaumburg Hotel and Convention Center continues to be a key draw for Schaumburg as it hosted 72 conventions with over 300,000 attendees in 2013. Schaumburg was ranked in Cvent's list of the top 50 cities for meetings and events in the United States for the second consecutive year.

The village also proceeded with the establishment of the North Schaumburg Tax Increment Financing (TIF) District in an area bounded roughly by I-90, Algonquin Road, Route 53, and Roselle Road. Creation of the TIF will allow the village to encourage private investment and redevelopment of this area to help address issues such as vacancy rates and declining assessed values. The village has already been able to attract two major businesses to the TIF area:

- Sunstar, an international manufacturer of oral hygiene products, is currently constructing a 300,000 square foot facility directly east of Medieval Times.
- Zurich Insurance announced its plans to move from the "Zurich Towers" on Meacham Road and construct a new North American Corporate Headquarters at the northwest corner of I-90 and Meacham Road. In total, over 2,900 jobs will be secured through these two projects.

Schaumburg welcomed a wide variety of new businesses, including 3D Exhibits, Bisi Restaurant, Cup & Vine, Hickory River Smokehouse, KOTRA, McGill Machine Works, Microsoft, Pancheros Mexican Grill, Pull'R Holding

Lamkin's appointment serves as the successful conclusion of a six-month process that began after the village appointed Interim Chief Ken Bouche to manage the department while a permanent chief was selected.

Chief Lamkin was identified as the top candidate from a very strong pool of candidates. I believe he will be an outstanding leader for the Schaumburg Police Department," said Village Manager Brian Townsend. Village President Larson stated, "Chief Lamkin comes to us with a wealth of experience and the ability to lead the Schaumburg Police Department into the future." Lamkin previously worked for the City of St. Charles in the position of Police Chief since 2003. Prior to that time, Lamkin worked for the Elgin Police Department, where he served for 23 years and achieved the rank of Deputy Chief. He is a graduate of Columbia College of Missouri, where he earned a Bachelor of Arts in Criminal Justice Administration. Lamkin is also a graduate of the 207th Session of the FBI National Academy in Quantico, Virginia.

### Brush Pickup Begins in May

Schaumburg's Brush Pick-up Program, runs for 24 weeks from May through October. It is not necessary to call for brush pick-up or to create a Customer Service Request, just follow the schedule as listed. Please note that zones and boundaries have changed from last year and that this program is open to single-family residences only.

Brush must be placed at the curb by 7am of the Monday of your scheduled week. It may take crews up to four days to complete collection.

#### Preparation

- Branches are to be neatly placed curbside with the cut ends toward the street. Unorganized or tangled brush piles will not be collected and the resident will be asked to re-stack the pile.
- Only branches from trees and bushes (up to eight inches in di-

ameter at the cut end) will be eligible for pick-up. Branches may be any length, though the ends must be cleanly cut with no attached root systems.

- Items larger than eight inches in diameter, materials such as construction wood, branches with nails or spikes, wooden fence pieces/doors, firewood logs, rose bushes, poison ivy, small hedge/evergreen trimmings, and yard rakings cannot be mulched and must be disposed of by the resident through other means.
- Brush pick-up at any one residence will be limited to approximately 100 square feet of front area along the parkway (approximately six feet high by 17 feet long).
- Contractor generated brush will not be collected.

### Mulch Pick-up

A limited amount of mulch (free of charge) will be available for pick-up at the Engineering and Public Works complex. Mulch is available while supplies last. Residents are asked to enter the complex at the traffic light located at 714 South Plum Grove Road and proceed beyond Fire Station 55 to the wood bin designated for mulch pick-up.

### Mulch Delivery

Double ground processed mulch is available to be delivered to residents for a fee. Please call 311 in Schaumburg to request delivery or fill out an online CSR and search for the keyword "Mulch." An invoice for the delivery will be mailed to the resident after the mulch is delivered. If you have any questions, call 311 in Schaumburg.

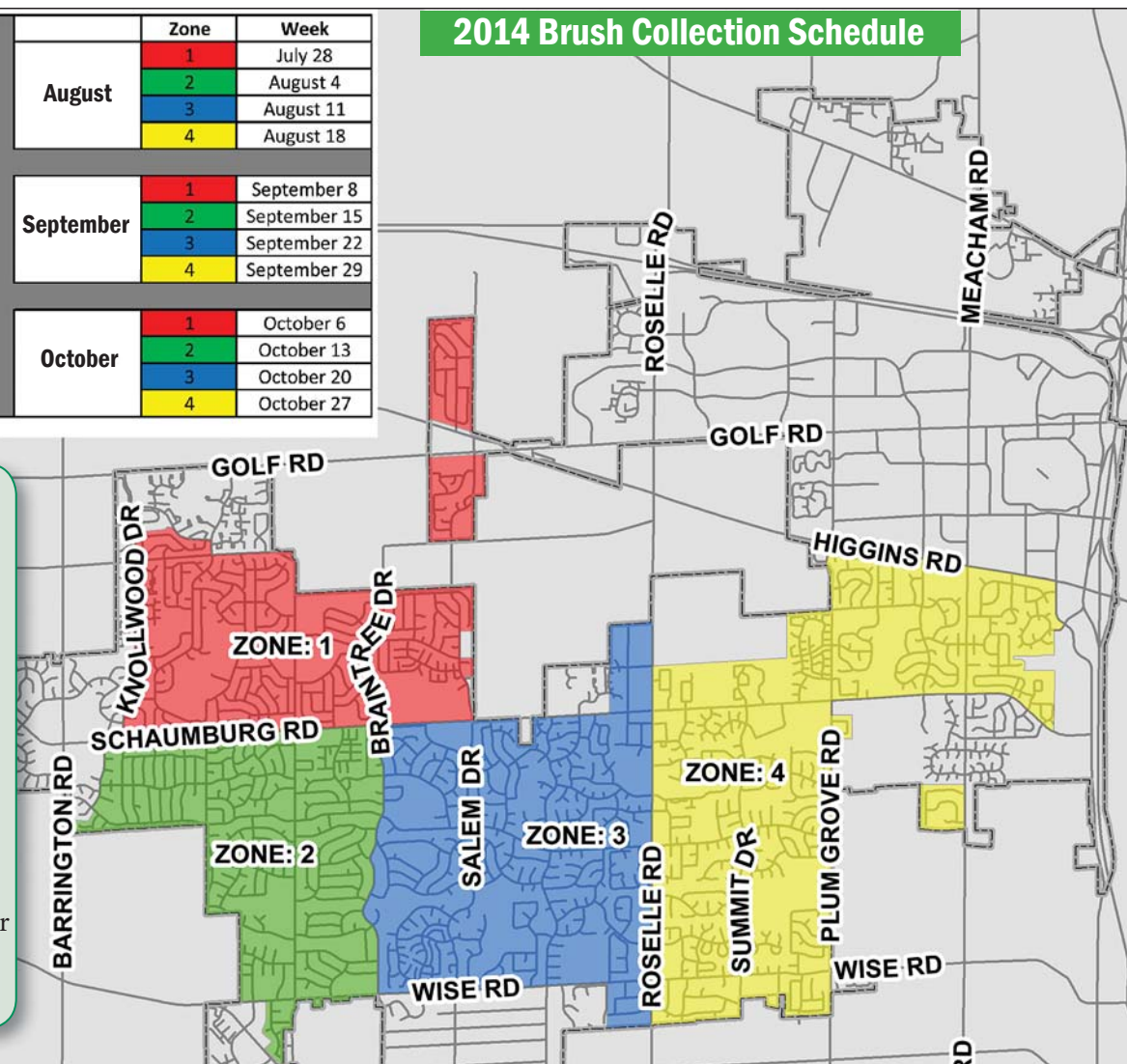
### 2014 Brush Collection Schedule

### 21st Annual Community Scholarships

**The 21st Annual Community Scholarship in cooperation with Business and Career Services, Inc. is now available.**

As a result of a joint scholarship development campaign in the business community, the Village of Schaumburg has been provided funding to award a scholarship(s) to qualified resident(s) to pursue educational training, upgrading, or retraining. The scholarship(s) can be applied towards tuition, books, and any other commensurate educational expenses. A President's Committee will select the scholarship winner(s).

#### Eligibility and Criteria:

- Must be a resident of Schaumburg
- Must be authorized to work in the United States
- Must demonstrate financial need
- May be a first-time, continuing, or returning student
- Must have education or career goals
- Must be interested in completing coursework that supports education or career goals
- Must demonstrate the ability to successfully complete coursework
- Must take coursework at an approved Illinois educational institution
- May submit only one application per person

#### Requirements

Candidates must complete the scholarship application, submit two references and photo identification — which includes date of birth and social security number (example: photocopy of driver's license and photocopy of social security card). Follow the directions given in each section of this application; failure to do so may result in disqualification. Be sure to complete and include the section of the application that covers financial need. Remember, applicants' answers and references are limited to the space provided. Typed applications are preferred.

#### Award

The scholarship recipient will be notified by Friday, April 25 or as soon as possible thereafter. The scholarship is valid until June 15, 2015, and is non-renewable.

#### Scholarship Administration

Scholarship recipients will not receive cash directly. The Associate Director at Business and Career Services, Inc. will assist the scholarship recipient with academic advising, enrollment, and payment directly to the educational institution of tuition, fees, books, and approved supplies not exceeding the amount of the scholarship. Eligibility for additional services provided through the Workforce Investment Act will also be reviewed with the recipients.

### Swans to Return to Municipal Center Pond in April

Louis and Serena are spending the winter in northern Illinois and will return in April. The village purchased the original pair in 1994 in response to the growing Canada Goose population on the municipal center pond and grounds. Breeding age pairs of mute swan will not tolerate Canada Geese in their breeding area, which can cover several acres of water. Mute swans are the hardiest of all waterfowl, mate for life, and live to be 10-15 years of age in captivity. There are normally five to seven offspring every year — hatching around Memorial Day.

Louis and Serena may be viewed from April to November on the municipal center grounds and pond via the "Swan Cam." Please recall that the swans have a special diet and should not be fed anything else. No fishing is allowed on the pond during their stay. Visit the website at:

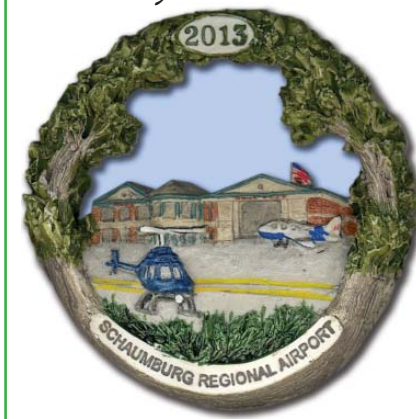
### Take Charge of Your Health

### Older Adult Market

The village has teamed up with the Greater Chicago Food Depository, the food bank that serves Cook County, to offer a free food market for seniors age 60 and over. The Older Adult Market is a choice-style food pantry that distributes fresh fruits and vegetables, as well as shelf-stable food items to older adults in the community and their households. Examples of the food that are distributed include fresh produce, rice and beans, canned fruits and vegetables, cereal/oatmeal, and canned chicken/tuna. The market is open from 1pm until 2:30pm (or until the food runs out) on alternating Fridays and are held at the Schaumburg Barn, 231 S. Civic Drive.

Participants will be asked to sign in at the market and acknowledge that they are 60-years of age or older, but no ID or other documents are required. A caregiver may pick up food for those who are unable to travel, after a proxy letter is signed. These letters are available at the market. Company, and Shigiya. 2013 also saw the development of the Meacham Gatherings, located on Meacham Road just north of Woodfield Road. The site offers approximately 19,000 square feet of restaurant space and is already home to The Beer Market, On the Border, Potbelly, Protein Bar, and Roti Mediterranean Grill.

2014 will also see several new businesses opening including American Society of Anesthesiologists, Arhaus, Chick-fil-A, Fairfield Inn & Suites, Towne Place Suites Hotel, IAI American Inc., Ricky B's Prime Burger House, and Trader Joe's.

The village routinely invests millions of dollars in capital improvements — providing safe roadways, sidewalks and infrastructure, and pleasant public areas to its residents and visitors. Over \$25 million in capital projects were scheduled for fiscal year 2013-14 including \$8.2 million in street resurfacing and reconstruction projects. The fiscal year 2014-2015



capital improvement plan proposes the largest expenditure the village has programmed for capital in many years, totaling \$31.3 million. As with past capital plans, the largest costs are allocated with roadways, but the majority of the increase is attributed to the village's cost share of the Roselle and Meacham Road interchanges. This proposed plan allocates approximately \$19.9 million to roadway projects. Included in this \$19.9 million, are the \$4.3 million for the village's fiscal year share of the Roselle and Meacham Road interchanges on the I-90 tollway.

Schaumburg is working with both the Illinois Toll Highway Authority and Cook County to finish the design on the completion of the interchange at

Roselle Road and I-90 and to add westbound on and off ramps at Meacham Road. In 2014, both bridges over I-90 will be completely replaced as the first step in adding interchange access at Meacham Road and completing the access at Roselle Road with I-90. This improved access is part of the Tollway's 'Move Illinois' program and will add vital access and relieve congestion along this corridor.

The Schaumburg-Barrington Road Improvement Project is a \$6.5 million project to widen and resurface the intersection to provide a more smooth-flowing intersection, and a better riding surface, as well as to upgrade the drainage, sidewalks, traffic signals, and lighting. Final surface, pavement marking, and landscaping will be completed in spring of 2014. In addition, a new traffic signal will be installed at Barrington Road and Holmes Way. Surface Transportation Program funds, Congestion Mitigation, and Air Quality funds were secured for the project.

Since 2008, more than 3,800 ash trees have been removed and stumped, and parkways have been restored with a multitude of diverse tree species to prevent significant loss in the future. Contractual EAB treatment of 8,693 Ash Trees has been completed.

Construction began on Pleasant Square, a residential development located at the Northwest corner of Schaumburg and Roselle Roads. A small public park at the corner of Schaumburg and Roselle Roads is also planned. The village is providing \$3.9 million in funding from the Olde Schaumburg Center Tax Increment Financing District for land acquisition and infrastructure. Although this TIF ended December 31, 2012, the village continues to complete previously approved TIF

projects. One of these final projects is the installation of a traffic signal at Roselle Road and Bethel Lane. The traffic signal will be installed in conjunction with a right turn lane from southbound Roselle Road to westbound Schaumburg Road; the turn lane will be funded by Cook County.

## Roselle Road Bike Access across the Jane Addams Tollway

The Illinois State Toll Highway Authority is proceeding with the design and construction of the widening of I-90. One of the interchange locations slated to receive improvements/upgrades is the Roselle Road interchange, which will be improved to provide full access. As part of this work, a shared use path along the west side of Roselle Road is planned to be extended north from its current terminus (between Hillcrest Boulevard and the Tollway) across the Tollway as part of the rebuilt bridge where it will intersect with Central Road and connect to the existing shared use path in the Paul Douglas Forest Preserve.

A contract for Phase I Design Study, which will include environmental analysis/studies of the area in question, alternatives analysis (to see what other ways there may be to get a crossing), geotechnical concerns (which analyzes the stability of the land on which the path would be built), and structure (bridge) analysis (to see the best ways to include it on the bridge) among other tasks, is underway.

A completion date for the entire project has not been determined at this point, though when completed, this will become the second point of access across the Jane Addams Tollway within Schaumburg (the first being at Meacham Road) and will provide connections between all of Schaumburg and Harper College, Paul Douglas and Crabtree Forest Preserves, and points north.



## Pace Route 602 – Schaumburg Metra Station Service

Leave the car at home and use Pace Route 602 to ride to Schaumburg's Metra Commuter Station. Pace Route 602 provides weekday rush hour service to meet Chicago-bound Metra trains at 6:08am and 7:16am. On the return trip, buses meet trains departing Chicago at 4:20pm (arriving in Schaumburg at 5:13pm), and 5:17pm (arriving in Schaumburg at 5:59pm).

Please note, there is no Saturday, Sunday, or holiday service.

Full fares are \$1.75 one-way. Reduced fares, \$.85, are available for children (ages 7-11), students traveling to and from school, senior citizens (65 years of age and older with a RTA Reduced Fare Permit), and persons with disabilities (with a RTA Reduced Fare Permit). Free rides are offered to persons 65 and older with a Senior Ride Free card or persons with a disability with a Ride Free card, children under 7, and active duty military personnel in uniform. ## I-90 Toll Highway Planned Improvements Begin in Spring

The village is working closely with the Illinois Toll Highway Authority on the proposed work on I-90 and the Roselle Road and future Meacham Road interchanges. Work scheduled to begin in the spring of 2014 includes the replacement of both the Roselle Road and Meacham Road bridges over I-90 to accommodate the widening of I-90 to four lanes in each direction. The village is working with both the Cook County Highway Department and Illinois State Toll Highway Authority and the completion of the Roselle Road Interchange to include both on and off ramps to the west and with the Toll Highway to construct on and off ramps for westbound traffic at Meacham Road. The full completion of the widening and the ramps is scheduled for fall of 2016.

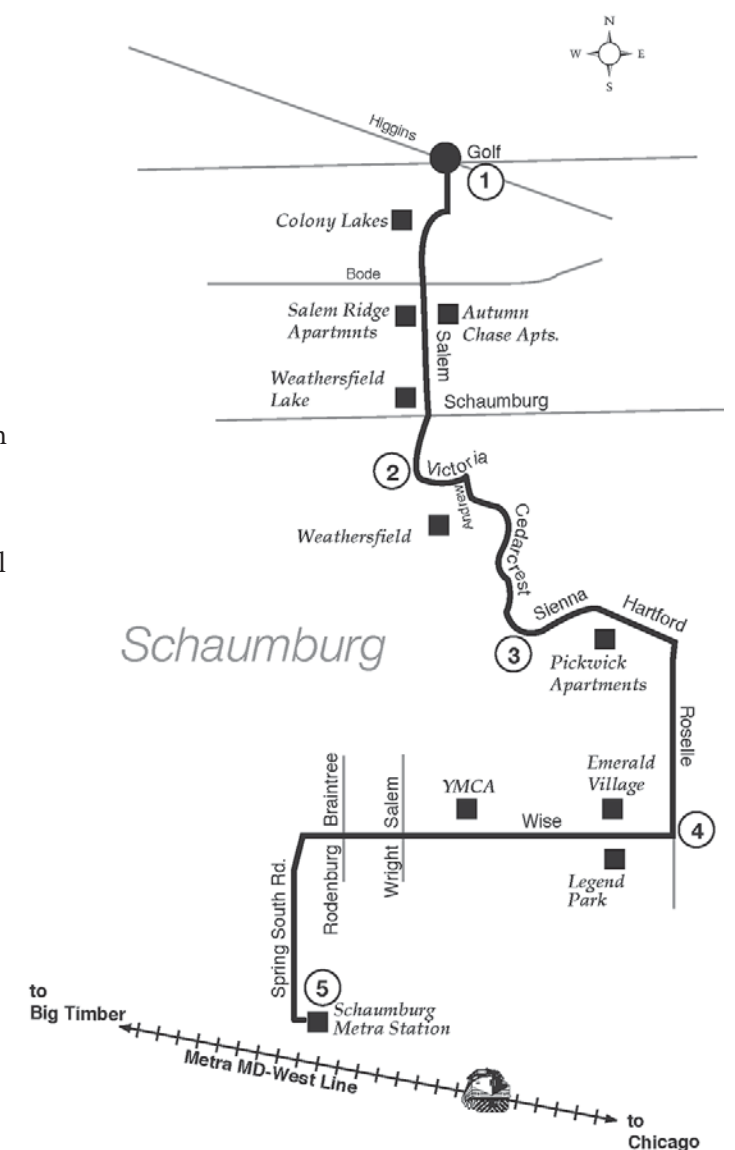

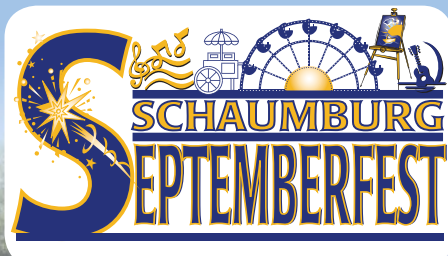
