



## ACADEMICALLY ORIENTED RENAL PATHOLOGIST

The Department of Pathology and Laboratory Medicine at Cedars-Sinai Medical Center is inviting applications for an academically oriented renal pathologist. The successful candidate should be board certified in Anatomic or Anatomic and Clinical Pathology with experience in all aspects of diagnostic renal pathology and housestaff education, and a program of, or strong potential for, clinical, translational or collaborative research. Applicants must have an M.D., M.D./Ph.D. or D.O. and have or be eligible for a California medical license. The successful applicant will join a subspecialized renal pathology division which currently accessions approximately 3300 biopsies annually and is composed of 4 pathologists with renal pathology as their primary or only clinical responsibility.

Cedars-Sinai is a 952-bed quaternary medical care facility and is the largest not-for-profit provider of health care on the west coast serving more than 9 million people in Los Angeles County. The Medical Center complex is located at the junction of Los Angeles and Beverly Hills. CPLM is an independently contracted pathology group providing exclusive Pathology services to the Cedars-Sinai Medical Center. The Department, with its 49 faculty, oversees a clinical operation of over 55,000 surgical cases, approximately 4 million laboratory tests, robust outreach and consultative referral practices and Experimental and Translational pathology facilities. There are 24 residents and fellows, with a funded renal pathology fellowship.
