- Discuss the epidemiology and etiology of HIV Disease;
- Discuss the CDC recommendations for the testing of persons for the presence of HIV;
- Discuss methods for managing a patient presenting to a reproductive health setting infected with or at risk for an STI;
- Discuss appropriate treatment modalities for common STDs or STIs;
- Identify components of an STD clinic;
- Identify components using surveillance data (from morbidity reports, clinic logs and medical records) for quality assurance and program planning;
- Describe the role of the disease intervention specialist (DIS) in STI control; and
- Demonstrate the skills necessary to determine the best course of action for managing a patient presenting to the STD clinic.
