Disability and Rehabilitation Research Projects and Centers Program: Rehabilitation Engineering Research Centers: Rehabilitation Strategies, Techniques, and Interventions (CFDA No. 84.133E-3)

Purpose: To plan and conduct research, demonstration projects, training, and related activities, including international activities; develop methods, procedures, and rehabilitation technology; maximize the full inclusion and integration into society, employment, independent living, family support, and economic and social self-sufficiency of individuals with disabilities.

Eligibility: State, county, city, township, and special district governments; independent school districts; private, public, and state controlled institutions of higher education; public housing authorities/Indian housing authorities; Native American tribal organizations; nonprofits; for-profit organizations other than small businesses; and small businesses.

Funding: \$950,000.

Early Career Awards: Systems-Based Research for Evaluating Ecological Impacts of Manufactured Chemicals (CFDA No. 66.509)

Purpose: To fund integrated, trans-disciplinary research that would advance scientific understanding of potential for impacts to ecosystem wellbeing associated with the use of manufactured chemicals; develop and apply innovative metrics and modeling approaches to improve evaluation of ecological resilience and impact analyses, and support environmental sustainability.

Eligibility: Public, private, and state controlled institutions of higher education; Native American tribal organizations; nonprofits, other than institutions of higher education; for-profit organizations other than small businesses.

Funding: \$4 million.

Independent Scientist Award (Parent K02) (CFDA Nos. 93.113, 93.121, 93.173, 93.242, 93.273, 93.279, 93.853, 93.865, and 93.866)

Purpose: To foster the development of outstanding scientists and enable them to expand their potential to make significant contributions to their field of research. Provides three, four, or five years of salary support and protected time for newly independent scientists who can demonstrate the need for a period of intensive research focus as a means of enhancing their research careers.

Eligibility: State, county, city, township, and special district governments; independent school districts; private, public, and state controlled institutions of higher education; public housing authorities/Indian housing authorities; Native American tribal organizations; nonprofits; for-profit organizations other than small businesses; and small businesses.

Funding: Not specified.

Nurse Education, Practice, Quality, and Retention Program – Veteran's Bachelor of Science Degree in Nursing (CFDA No. 93.359)

Purpose: To develop and implement innovative career ladder programs that will increase the enrollment, progression, and graduation of veterans in Bachelor of Science in Nursing programs; support Health Resources and Services Administration's strategic plan to improve access to quality health care and services; strengthen the nation's healthcare workforce; build healthy communities; and improve health equity.

Eligibility: Eligible applicants include accredited schools of nursing, a health care facility, or partnership of such a school and facility.

Office of Elementary and Secondary Education (OESE): High School Equivalency Program (HEP) (CFDA No. 84.141A)

Purpose: To help migrant and seasonal farm workers and members of their immediate family obtain a general education diploma that meets the guidelines for high school equivalency established by the state in which the HEP project is conducted; and gain employment or be placed in an institution of higher education (IHE) or other postsecondary education or training.

Eligibility: IHEs or private nonprofit organizations (including faith-based organizations) that plan their projects in cooperation with an IHE and propose to operate some aspects of the project with the facilities of the IHE.

Reducing Health Disparities Among Minority and Underserved Children (CFDA Nos. 93.173, 93.273, and 93.361)

Purpose: To encourage research that targets the reduction of health disparities among children, target areas of research including bio-behavioral studies that incorporate multiple factors that influence child health disparities such as biological (e.g., genetics, cellular, organ systems), lifestyle factors, environmental (e.g., physical and family environments) social (e.g., peers), economic, institutional, and cultural and family influences; studies that target the specific health promotion needs of children with a known health condition and/or disability; and studies that test and evaluate the comparative effectiveness of health promotion interventions conducted in traditional and nontraditional settings.

Eligibility: State, county, city, township, and special district governments; independent school districts; private, public, and state controlled institutions of higher education; public housing authorities/Indian housing authorities; Native American tribal organizations; nonprofits; for-profit organizations other than small businesses; and small businesses.

Funding: \$200,000.

Purpose: To build the scientific base for the prevention of violence by helping to expand and advance our understanding of the primary prevention of interpersonal violence; encourage professionals from a wide spectrum of disciplines of epidemiology, behavioral and social sciences, medicine, biostatistics, public health, health economics, law, and criminal justice to perform research in order to prevent violence more effectively; encourage investigators to propose research that involves the development and testing of primary prevention strategies, programs and policies designed to prevent interpersonal violence and reduce violence-related outcomes as well as dissemination, implementation, and translation research to enhance the adoption and maintenance of effective strategies among individuals, organizations, or communities.

Secure and Trustworthy Cyberspace: Secure, Trustworthy, Assured, and Resilient Semiconductors and Systems (CFDA Nos. 47.041 and 47.070)

Purpose: To support research on new strategies for architecture, specification and verification, especially at the stages of design in which formal methods are currently weak or absent, with the aim of decreasing the likelihood of unintended behavior or access, increasing resistance and resilience to tampering, and improving the ability to provide authentication throughout the supply chain and in the field.
