

Dr. Marian Moca is one of the newest faculty additions at the UT Health Science Center San Antonio-Regional Academic Health Center. He is currently developing a new residency program to train physicians to become child & adolescent psychiatrists and serve children and their families across the Valley.

Dr. Moca comes from the University of Connecticut Health Center department of psychiatry where he functioned as assistant professor of psychiatry within the division of child and adolescent psychiatry. He worked closely with medical students, residents in general psychiatry and fellows in child & adolescent psychiatry. During his time at the University of Connecticut, School of Medicine, he personally provided psychiatric care to children and their families in the greater Hartford area.

Fresh out of medical school, he served as a pediatric unit director in a small border town in his native Romania. During this time he cared for children with both physical illnesses and emotional disturbances. He completed his Psychiatry residency from Maimonides Medical Center (Brooklyn, NY) and his Child & Adolescent Psychiatry fellowship from Yale Child Study Center (New Haven, CT).

His major areas of interest in psychiatry include childhood trauma, attachment disorders, adoptions, and developmental psychopathology. This led to additional training at the Harris-Cohen Center for Trauma and Disaster Intervention in Tel Aviv, Israel and the Anna Freud Centre in London, UK. Dr. Moca devotes his attention to issues related to public health as well as medical education in (child) psychiatry.

Dr. Moca continues to maintain his affiliation with the Yale University Child Study Center as voluntary faculty. He is certified in both adult and child & adolescent psychiatry by the American Board of Psychiatry and Neurology (ABPN).
