



Spirituality and Justice Award



All Saints Parish will present its 17th Spirituality and Justice Award on December 7, 2014 during the Sunday worship service. The recipient of this year's award is David Adams, EdD, co-founder and Co-Director of Emerge, the first counseling program in the nation for men who abuse women, established in 1977. Dr. Adams has led groups for men who batter, and conducted outreach to victims of abuse for 36 years. He has led parenting education classes for fathers for 12 years. He is one of the nation's leading experts on men who batter and has conducted trainings of social service and criminal justice professionals in 45 states and 16 nations. He has published numerous articles and book chapters, including "Identifying the Assaultive Husband in Court: You Be the Judge," published in the Boston Bar Journal, he also writes a featured blog on the Huffington Post. Dr. Adams is a Commissioner on the Massachusetts Governor's Council on Sexual and Domestic Violence and Director of the National Domestic Violence Risk Assessment and Management Training Project. His book, *Why Do They Kill? Men Who Murder Their Intimate Partners* was published by Vanderbilt University Press in 2007.

David is a longtime member of Grace Episcopal Church in Newton where he is the co-chair of the Social Action Committee. David was a past board member of Safe Havens Interfaith Partnership on Domestic Violence. Besides helping to heal perpetrators of domestic violence, another of David's ministries is working to promote greater awareness and stewardship of the environment. He writes a weekly column called Grace Green Tips for the Grace bulletin and submits occasional pieces on ecological awareness and protection for other publications. David also uses church humor as a vehicle for social justice in his new sideline as a stand-up comedian.

David will preach at the December 6th Celtic Eucharist and on December 7th where he will be receive the Spirituality and Justice Award. A luncheon with David will be hosted by the Adult Education Committee following the service on December 7. All are invited.

The Wardens' Corner: Construction Update

The sanctuary repair project begun last May will be finishing up in the month of November. We did not intend for the construction season to parallel the season of Pentecost, but that has been the way it has turned out! Extensive repointing work has been done on the exterior walls of the Beacon Street and Dean Road sides of the sanctuary and several buttresses have been rebuilt or undergone extensive repair. Metal through flashing to prevent water intrusion has been added in several significant locations, including underneath the coping stones which form the peak at the top the Beacon Street face and even under the cross at the very highest point. Roofs and gutters have been repaired and replaced and several of the windows re-sealed at the edges.



For all this work, the exterior face of the church looks basically the same. Yet the work was essential to address the serious water leaks that have been causing increasing damage to the church.

The most apparent change from this project is to the interior Beacon Street wall of the sanctuary and its large window. The interior face of the wall is no longer plaster, like the rest of the church. Instead this wall is a rough surface, exposed masonry wall that has been painted white. The absence of the plaster surface will enable us to determine over the next few years whether all of the leaks have been arrested. Several people have remarked that this wall surface is actually attractive as well. The large Beacon Street window currently contains painted plywood in the locations where stained glass should be. Next spring, the re-leaded diamond pane window framework will be reinstalled, along with a glass frame on the exterior of the window to provide long-term protection for both the stained glass and the extensively repaired wood window frame.

Next door at the rectory, the interior space has been reconfigured into 4 living units and electrical, plumbing and other work is well underway. We are hopeful that the Burden family will be able to move into their unit in the rectory by the end of 2014, though we expect the other units will take a few additional months to complete.

The financing for these large projects relies primarily on three sources of funds: an investment from the parish endowment in the creation of the rental units; proceeds from the Together Now campaign which All Saints parishioners have committed to fulfilling over a five year period; and a line of credit from Century Bank, which provides money on favorable terms that we will need to repay over the next several years.

From the Director of Children's, Youth, & Family Ministries



During the liturgical seasons of Advent, Christmas, & Epiphany, our children and young people will be immersed in the stories of Jesus' birth and ministry. If you do not have children in our formation programs, but want to see what we are doing, please contact Becky Taylor to arrange a visit to a classroom. Or, if you are sensing a call to teach or mentor, Becky will explore that with you. Get in touch!

During Advent (December 7, 14, & 21)

- Cherubs will journey with the Prophets, the Holy Family, the Shepherds and the Magi on the way to Bethlehem and the mystery that is Christmas.
- 2nd – 5th Graders will prepare for Christmas story with a unit called "John, A Voice Crying in the Wilderness"
- 6th – 8th Graders will continue to consider the theme for the year, "God loves us, no matter what," in light of Isaiah's prophecies and the annunciation stories of both Mary and Joseph. They will also be helping to organize the Christmas party for children at B-READY after school program in Roxbury.
- 9th – 12th Graders will reflect on the theme of "God with us" as they organize the parish gift drive for the residents of Crossroads Shelter.

During Epiphany (January 4, 11 & 25; Feb 1)

- Cherubs will explore the sacrament of Baptism and wonder about Jesus' parables.
- 2nd – 5th Graders will explore the sacrament of Baptism and what it means to be "marked as Christ's own forever."
- 6th – 8th Graders will look at Jesus' teachings about the Kingdom of God and celebrate the beginning of the journey to adulthood for 5 members of the class.
- 9th – 12th Graders will finish up the 12-session overview of the Bible (which began in September) and get ready to begin the preparations for the sacramental rite of Confirmation in the spring.

There will be No Classes during public school vacations (Dec 28, Jan 18 & Feb 15) and Feb 8 (Rite-13 Sunday)

Youth Chapel happens at 10:15am on the Sundays when Church School classes are scheduled. Kids and adult mentors in Grades 2-12 meet in the dining room for a simple service of prayer and scripture reflection before heading off to class. The door is always open to visitors. Come!

Search Committee: Music Director Update

The Search Committee for a new Music Director recently completed a written job description for the position which will be posted at several key websites, including the American Guild of Organists (AGO). Soon after this posting, the Committee should begin receiving resumes from interested individuals. Our consideration of each applicant will include a review of submitted material and, where the applicant appears promising, a telephone interview and, for candidates within a given geographical range, attendance by Committee members at a service at the applicant's present church. We expect to have a field of several finalists by late April or May, each of which will be asked to visit All Saints to conduct a rehearsal of the choir, to play the organ, and to meet with the Rector and staff. The Committee will then recommend one of the candidates to the Rector, who will make the final decision. Unless there are unusual circumstances, the new Music Director would begin his or her new position here in September.

Adult Education Opportunities

Exploring the Sacraments: Baptism & Confirmation

In Epiphany the “Exploration of the Sacraments” course continues with a look at Baptism and Confirmation. This year long series of short courses is being offered instead of “Journeys in Faith.”

Baptism initiates us into Christ’s One Holy Catholic and Apostolic Church. And those who have been baptized at an early age are expected, when they are ready and have been duly prepared, to make a mature public affirmation of their faith. This form of initiation into the Episcopal Church takes place through the rites of confirmation and reception.

“Confirmation is the rite in which we express a mature commitment to Christ, and receive strength from the Holy Spirit through prayer and laying on of hands by a bishop. It is required of those to be confirmed that they have been baptized, are sufficiently instructed in the Christian Faith, are penitent for their sins, and are ready to affirm their confession of Jesus Christ as Savior and Lord.” (Book of Common Prayer, page 860).

Becky Taylor and the high school mentor team will be leading a Confirmation Class for youth this winter and spring. Richard and Becky will be leading a one session class for adults to explore the sacrament of Baptism and Confirmation on Saturday Jan. 24. If you are an adult and have been baptized and confirmed in another catholic communion, you may be received into the Episcopal Church in a ceremony presided over by the bishop. A period of preparation and study with the rector, the director of religious education, and/or other mature Christians is required. Any adult interested in receiving one of these rites should contact Richard to discuss it. The Deanery confirmation service will take place on Saturday, May 2nd.


Advent Retreat December 6, 9:00am-12:30pm

2/15—Dismissal/Liturgy of the Neighbor


