I was 13 years old when I entered the Summer Youth Program, which was a federally-funded youth jobs program much like the YouthWorks program and part of the war on poverty in 1965. This program involved leadership skills, mentoring, and employment skills and helped me shape my personal beliefs. It made me who I am today- a forward thinker. I think developing our youth is extremely important to our future and can make a huge difference in a young person's life.

How has your career changed going from working in the non-profit sector to now working in the private sector?

During my career, I took opportunities to work at both private sector and non-profit organizations. Having experienced both sides, it gives me a full understanding of both mindsets and goals. This helps me in my role as Chair of the YWIC to better understand how to engage our local businesses.

What advice do you have for job seekers looking to get into the Home Health Industry?

My advice to job seekers is to get involved in the industry as soon as you can. If you are in high school or college and thinking about a career in the Home Health Industry by structuring your courses in math, science, and other related subjects.
