The <u>Alabama GRIT</u> team is encouraged that parents and others interested in learning more about the state's mathematics" and English standards can visit the <u>Standards Review website</u> today through the week of December 15, 2014 to offer feedback by grade. Each week, standards for each grade are available for review and comment, beginning with Kindergarten.

"We applaud the efforts of the Alabama State Department of Education for developing the 'Standards Review' website to give parents another opportunity to participate in setting the bar our students and teachers are expected to meet inside the classroom," said **Caroline Novak**, *the president of A Plus Education Partnership and the co-chair of Alabama GRIT*. "The state's College and Career Ready Standards initiative for mathematics and English is one of the most misunderstood education efforts in recent years, and the state department's website is a convenient way for parents to learn what the standards truly entail and provide feedback on what we should expect our students to learn each year."

According to the ASDE, upon conclusion of the public review, the feedback generated will go to the state Mathematics and English/Language Arts Course of Study (COS) teams. The only comments that will be considered for action will be those of academic substance that are tied to a specific standard. The COS teams may then provide recommendations to the Alabama State Board of Education.

Alabama's College and Career Ready Standards for mathematics and English Language Arts were adopted by the state Board of Education in 2010 upon the recommendation of a committee made up of Alabama parents and teachers. The Board voted to reaffirm its adoption of the standards in 2011 and Alabama's public schools began implementing the mathematics standards in the 2012-13 school year, and English during the 2013-14 school year.
