Accidental bowel leakage (ABL) is the accidental passing of solid or liquid stool or mucus from the rectum. ABL episodes can be unexpected and happen suddenly at inconvenient times.

ABL affects 1 in 5 women over 45 years old, but most women do not talk to a health care provider about this issue.

Researchers at UW are trying to understand reasons why women with ABL may not talk to a health care provider.
