

Five new members joined our Board of Directors this year. They bring a combined impressive depth of experience to At Home on the Sound. We are happy to welcome them.





Profile

Bob Milburn, Member

One of our newest members, Bob Millburn is also an active At Home volunteer, driving fellow members to various appointments and events. When I asked Bob how he came to be a volunteer driver, he said, "my wife (board member Friedhilde Milburn)." But when I asked him why he continues to drive, he said the people he has met are so interesting that he would love to see oral histories recorded. And this is coming from a man who has certainly had and still has a very interesting life.



Born in Lubbock, Texas, Bob lived in many different places as a young boy. A scholarship to Andover Prep brought him East, and he went on to Columbia College School of Architecture. During the Berlin crisis, he was drafted into the Army. Sent to Karlsruhe, Germany, he met Friedhilde at a *Fasching* (Mardi Gras) ball. He said, "I wooed her in my old Mercedes, which I bought for a \$150 from a second lieutenant.

Bob returned to Columbia; Friedhilde followed on a Norwegian freighter from Germany, and six months later they were married.

Bob learned to sail in Vermont through one of his summer jobs while in college. But it was Friedhilde who got the family into it while on a vacation in Martha's Vineyard. They bought a classic Ensign sailboat in 1977 from Nichols Yacht Yard. While sailing, they would often pass 490 Bleeker Street in Mamaroneck, and Bob said not only did the building have wonderful architectural detail, but "there were always people sitting out by the pool and partying." So in 1990 he and Friedhilde bought a condo and moved from Manhattan to Mamaroneck.

Members of Larchmont Yacht Club, Bob and Friedhilde have cruised on Long Island Sound, the Gulf of Maine, and on larger boats in Greece. Together, they raced their Ensign for 23 years in Yacht Racing Association on Long Island Sound.

In 2005 Bob retired as Associate Partner from Pei Cobb & Partners where he had worked on the JFK Presidential Library, the Javits Center, National Constitution Center in Philadelphia, and other projects.
