Who:

All youth participating in local and county fairs in Michigan (open to any age youth, both urban and rural, who are eligible to enter their fair as a youth exhibitor). Past winners are welcome to apply; preference will be given to those who have not received a Gold Ribbon Scholarship in the past.

What:

For the Great Lakes Agricultural Fair Gold Ribbon Scholarship Program[™], youth participating as youth exhibitors in each of the following categories will compile a written and verbal presentation of their respective exhibits.

Categories:

- · Large livestock (beef, sheep, swine, horses, llamas and dairy)
- Small animals (poultry, rabbits, cavies, pocket pets, cats, dogs, and goats)
- Static exhibits (crafts, horticulture, foods, educational, performing arts and communication, etc.)

Award Levels: \$1,000.00 (three given, one in each category) and \$500.00 (three given, one in each category)

Michigan Association of Fairs and Exhibitions (MAFE) Annual Meeting and Convention held at the Grand Rapids Amway Hotel on January 10, 2015.



When:

January 10, 2015 (deadline for applications November 1, 2014)

Why:

To further the GLAF mission of providing opportunities for the development and promotion of agriculture, education, industry and family entertainment while preserving our Michigan heritage.

- Applications must include the signature of a Fair Official or Extension Official
 of the hosting county fair, verifying that the applicant participated in the division
 they are applying for during the 2014 fair season.
- Up to one applicant from each fair will be selected to compete from each category for the two award levels to give a verbal presentation at the Michigan Association of Fairs and Exhibitions Annual Meeting and Convention to be held in Grand Rapids on Saturday, January 10, 2015.
- The selected participants will be notified by December 1, 2014.
- Award recipients will be selected based on competitive judging of the application and presentation.
- All scholarship awards will be deposited in a Michigan sponsored 529 CREF savings account.
