Scott W. Simmons is a Senior Management Analyst and the Strategic National Stockpile (SNS) Coordinator for the City of San Antonio Metropolitan Health District, Public Health Emergency Preparedness Division, San Antonio, Texas. He serves as the senior coordinator responsible for developing, maintaining and monitoring dynamic and comprehensive plans, policies and procedures to receive and distribute the SNS Stockpile to the 1.8 million residents within Bexar County in the event of an emergency/disaster or a public health crisis due to naturally occurring epidemic/pandemic or a bio-terrorism event.
