*5. WRITE A BRIEF CHARACTER ANALYSIS: This should be an in-depth analysis of the character and his/her relationship to the other characters in the play.

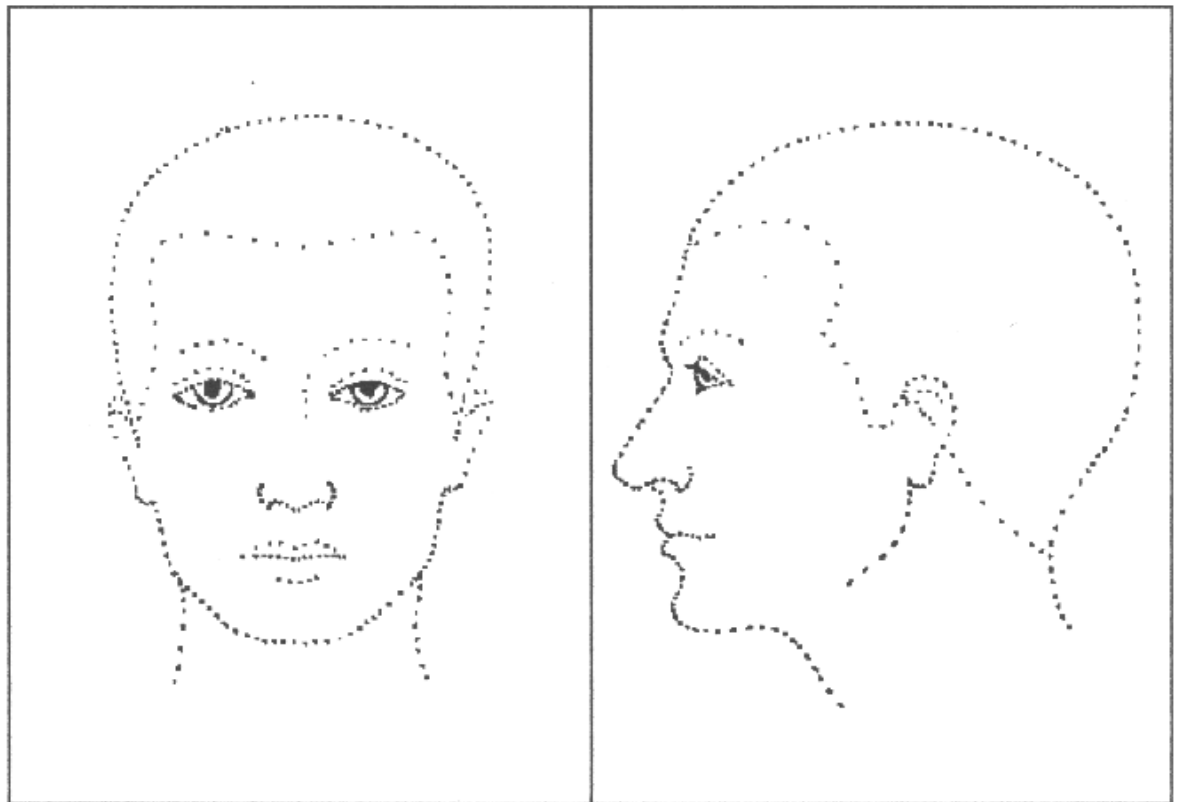
