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## 15<sup>th</sup> Annual Spring Conference: Dementia & Alzheimer's Disease *Innovations in Treatment*

Hyannis, MA – On March 13, leading experts in Alzheimer's disease and related dementias will provide information on Alzheimer's disease, its causes and the current trends in research and available treatment options. - Dr. Donald S. Marks, Neurologist
  - Dr. Donald Marks has been a practicing community neurologist since 1985, with a focus on neurodegenerative diseases. Since 1993 he has been actively involved in clinical trials of new Alzheimer's drugs to both treat symptoms and slow down disease progression. A particular interest for Dr. Marks is "translating" clinical research in a meaningful way for caregivers, patients and all health care professionals.
- Marcy JT Smith, MS RN FAIS BCETS
  - Marcy JT Smith is board certified by the American Academy of Experts in Traumatic Stress and the National Crisis Center. She has studied and collaborated with Hans Selye M.D. PhD. D.Sc. known for his discovery of the stress response. Together they developed a model for the variables of the stress response which guides assessment and intervention strategies for stress related disorders. Her presentation will focus on stress in dementia.

"While the focus of current research and clinical drug trials is to find a cure or treatment to halt disease progression, most of us simply struggle to stay current with our knowledge and options for dealing with our loved ones," said David Rehm, president & CEO, HopeHealth. "With one in nine over the age of 65 affected by Alzheimer's, it's vital that caregivers and medical professionals continually learn about the ever-changing field of Alzheimer's disease and dementia."
