The UCLA Clinical and Translational Science Institute (CTSI) will be holding an all-day workshop for investigators at the CTSI partnered institutions (Cedars-Sinai, CDU, LA Biomed at Harbor-UCLA, and UCLA) to learn about how to prepare successful R grant applications.

During the morning session of this K to R Workshop, presentations will be made by UCLA CTSI faculty on different topics about submitting R grant applications. During the afternoon session, faculty will review and discuss draft R grant plans/proposals submitted by K/CDA awardees and provide feedback on preparing successful R grant applications on an individual basis.

MORNING SESSION PRESENTATIONS

Open registration – there are no requirements to register for the K to R Workshop Presentations.

AFTERNOON REVIEW & DISCUSSION SESSIONS (limited registration on a first come first serve basis)

Who is eligible?

Participants must have a K award, or equivalent foundation or professional organization CDAs, and plan to submit an R type application or equivalent. Acceptable grant types include R01, R03, R21, VA Merit, subspecialty type research applications (e.g. ADA, AHA, JDF, ATA). Candidates must also have a faculty appointment at one of the UCLA CTSI partnered institutions.

Participant must provide the working title of the grant proposal and areas of research as instructed in the registration form so that the CTSI can try to identity faculty reviewers who can provide initial feedback and potentially long-term mentoring during the development of the proposal.

What is the format for the Review & Discussion Session?

Selected junior investigators (K/CDA awardees) will be required to give a 15-minute PowerPoint presentation of their plans for submitting an R grant application. Reviewers will spend the next 30 minutes to provide guidance and feedback for each junior investigator.

What do I need to submit to be considered to participate in the Review & Discussion Session?
