Program Description

The University of Texas Health Northeast will present two 7-hour agricultural medicine training programs in conjunction with the Texas Rural Health Association! Content will be delivered over two years during the TRHA annual conference. Hundreds of rural physicians, nurses, veterinarians, healthcare professionals, health educators and medical students/residents have received this premier educational experience over the last 40 years. Originally developed by Iowa's Center for Agricultural Safety and Health (I-CASH), the curriculum has been adapted to reflect the distinct essence of rural Texas and is taught by regional faculty, as well as the program's pioneer, Dr. Kelley Donham.
