



#### **SOMEC Website**

The SOMEC website is now live and ready for use at www.somec-project.eu

The website contains an overview of the project and its' partners; information about key events; and various documents for download such as information leaflets in several languages, newsletters, board meeting agendas and minutes.

Over the coming months a number of project reports will also be made available on the website including a report on the scope of the problem and a literature review on existing information exchange mechanisms

Eventually the website will host all of the outputs from the project including each research report as well as the guidance handbook for offender management and law enforcement officials working on the exchange of serious mobile offenders across the European Union.

### **SOMEC Research**

The SOMEC research is ongoing and there is still much work to be done. However, there are some general observations that have been made so far. Such as:

- There is a general consensus across Europe on what defines violent and sexual offenders.
- ➤ Exchanges of conviction data, intelligence and criminality information for investigation purposes occur across Member States utilising a variety of existing information exchange mechanisms.
- Exchanges of criminality information for the purpose of preventing a future crime are far less likely to occur across the EU community.



# **SOMEC Task Groups**

As part of the ongoing research, a series of task groups are to be held to develop the findings to date and to examine the critical factors for effective information exchange and management of mobile serious and sexual offenders.

The following three task groups are going to be taking place over the coming months:

  Latvia 3<sup>rd</sup> and 4<sup>th</sup> June 2014, Riga
  The Netherlands 8<sup>th</sup> and 9<sup>th</sup> July 2014, The Hague
