Fatherhood Practitioners & Healthy Relationship Certificate

Over 4,000 Continuing Education Units approved by National Association of Social Work and has been extended to practitioners from Japan, Australia, Puerto Rico, and throughout the United States since 2012. The Facilitator Fatherhood-Healthy Marriage Relationship Educator Program is a comprehensive program addressing six core learning areas to improve fatherhood and family service professional capacity. The Instructional Council is led by professors from prestigious institutions of higher education that with FFCA developed a model facilitator certification program. By design we bring on a practitioner (non-faculty member) to compliment the overall goals of this certificate program.

*This is a special full-day, non-repeating track where attendees must participate the full seven hours of CEUs training, reflective learning, action plan and self-assessment required for certification. Participants will be able to do the following by the end of the course instruction:

- 1. Participate in strategic planning, program self-assessment and other efforts to improve program services and agency responsiveness to families with an introduction of the Practitioners Effective Fatherhood Services Scale and additional program standards.
- 2. Identify alternative family engagement theories of parenting education and apply these to current or future work.
- 3. Develop strength-based assessments for family engagement: goal development, strengths, resources and support networks, as well as necessary services and supports.
- 4. Know the role of fathers in child development and parenting.
- 5. Develop facilitation skills for fatherhood and healthy relationship programs.
- 6. Gain the understanding of enhancing systems impact on father inclusive policies and practices (criminal justice, child welfare, education, health and mental health).
- 7. Gain instructional and curriculum design and development skills; and
- 8. Learn culturally appropriate strategies for working with fathers and families.









Danny K. Davis was chosen by the people of the 7th Congressional District of Illinois as their Representative in Congress on November 5, 1996. He has been re-elected by large majorities to succeeding Congresses. In the 112th Congress, Representative Davis serves on Oversight and Government Reform Committee and is Ranking Member of the Subcommittee on Health Care, District of Columbia, Census and the National Archives and serves on the Subcommittee on Federal Workforce, Postal, and Labor. The Congressman also serves on the Homeland Security Committee where his subcommittee assignments are the Subcommittee on Transportation and the Subcommittee on Oversight. Congressman Davis is a member of several Congressional Caucuses including the Congressional Black Caucus, the Progressive Caucus, the Urban Caucus, the Community Health Center's Caucus, and the Congressional Sugar Caucus.

Congressman Davis has distinguished himself as an articulate voice for his constituents and as an effective legislator able to move major bills to passage. He has developed a unique and energetic style of communication and interaction with his constituents setting up dozens of advisory task forces to consider significant questions of public policy. He hosts several weekly television and radio shows which feature audience call in and produces regular written reports to every household in the district. In addition, he maintains weekly office hours in the district and is widely sought after as a speaker at district events.

In the 112th Congress Representative Davis has indicated a focus on issues of poverty, health care, education, youth and criminal justice reform. Prior to his election to the Congress he served on the Cook County Board of Commissioners having been elected in November 1990 and reelected in November 1994. Previously, he served for eleven years as a member of the Chicago City Council as Alderman of the 29th Ward.

Before seeking public office Congressman Davis had productive careers as an educator, community organizer, health planner/administrator and civil rights advocate. He has received hundreds of awards and citations for outstanding work in the areas of health, education, human relations, politics and advocacy including six honorary Doctorate Degrees from well-known Colleges and Universities. He has traveled extensively throughout the United States and has spent time in Africa, Europe, the Middle East, and Asia and in South and Central America.

Born in Parkdale, Arkansas, on September 6, 1941, Congressman Davis moved to the Westside of Chicago in 1961, after having earned a Bachelor of Arts degree from Arkansas A.M. & N. College. He subsequently earned both Masters and Doctorate degrees respectively from Chicago State University and the Union Institute in Cincinnati, Ohio. He is married to Vera G. Davis, has two sons, Jonathan and Stacey, and is a member and Deacon of the New Galilee M.B. Church. Congressman Davis is the recipient of many awards and citations, including six honorary Doctorate Degrees from well-known Colleges and Universities.
