

Help Build a New Challenge Course at Mingus Mountain Camp Next Spring



Preschool Celebrates Spirit Days, Dads, Halloween and Zoo Lights Fundraiser

Coins for Caring Mission Project

This year, the children in our 3-year-old, Pre-k classes and Junior Kindergarten class have the opportunity to participate in a new mission project: "Coins for Caring."

During the month of September, the children learned about how God created the world and what we can do to take care of God's world. Each of the classrooms created a "Coins for Caring" bank using recycled materials. The banks will stay in the classroom, and throughout the preschool year, the children are invited to bring pennies, nickels, dimes, etc. to go towards the upkeep and care of the PVUMC Biblical Garden.

The children will be taking walking field trips to the Biblical Garden to learn more about God's world and how our coin collections will help take care of the plants, fish and the water feature. We may help to plant vegetation or clean up the area too. Each month, the children will have the opportunity to count and learn about money in their classrooms, then the coins will be given to one of the PVUMC pastors when they visit and teach in the chapel the first week of each month.

Welcome Tommy Strawser

Tommy Strawser (right) leads the Sunday Morning Children's and Youth choirs. During the week, he works with Childsplay, a local theater company, and is a tenor with the Phoenix Chorale. He talks here about how he found PVUMC, what his hopes



are for the church choirs, and how he juggles his work.

Q: What made you apply for the youth and children's choir director job here at PVUMC?

A. I was looking for the next step in my life, to become a leader where I would be able to use my skills as a musician and choral expert. One day, I had a weird feeling – a nudge – and checked http://www.choralnet.org/ even though I hadn't for a long time. I had been praying about an opportunity when I found the posting [for the choir director position with PVUMC]. I had been working with Childsplay, teaching musical theater to 6-9 year-olds and had worked with teens/preteens. I toured with Childsplay too – a one-man show called Apollo to the Moon – visiting K-6 schools, churches and community centers in Nogales, Tucson, Yuma, Peoria, etc.

Q: What do you hope to accomplish with the children and youth while you're here?

I'm hoping to get the kids as excited about music as I am. It's an outlet of expression/devotion that I've used my entire life that I'm happy to pass along. I want to create music appreciators and I want them to have a good time too – singing with friends in the choir. I hope to start a solid music program with the kids here, eventually adding different ensembles.

Q: How will you juggle this part-time job with your other career as a tenor with the Phoenix Chorale and as an actor?

My work with Childsplay is Monday-Friday. I am very organized with my seasonal calendar. When I am in the off-season, I'm doing a lot of pre-planning.

Q: What is your faith background?

I was raised in the United Methodist Church, and attended church in Pennsylvania. I went to church weekly with my parents and grandparents. Later, when my parents divorced, only one person from the

church reached out to my family; we felt stigmatized. Eventually, the three UMC churches in the town combined into one – Hope UMC – and I returned, but always felt some distance.

During college, and after college, Tommy has been a staff singer in various churches. He's always had a music-related job in church. "God showed me he still wanted me there. I try to keep an open mind and listen more often than search. Trinity Episcopal was very welcoming, and I felt at home there, but it feels welcoming here too, and I'm happy to be here," he said.— Pam Selthun
