Peace Day's theme this year is *Right of Peoples to Peace*.

Peace Day activities are flexible and can connect with multiple curriculum areas, after school programs, anti-bullying campaigns and restorative justice programs. Activities can be classroom based or school-wide. You can even adjust the date of your activities to fit your school's schedule.

Peace Day activities can involve the arts, writing, discussion, intercultural activities, community service, sports, environmental projects and so much more. <u>Some examples</u>: Create collaborative peace posters - Fold and exchange peace cranes - Clean up trash in your community - Join the *Armed with the Arts* Peace Day Sing Along - Write and share poems on the *Right to Peace* - Start or enhance a recycling program at your school - Discuss quotes of Peacemakers - Do a service project or fundraiser for a good cause, local or global - Learn about a human rights issue affecting children somewhere else in the world - Engage in Peace Breathing - Write and sign a pledge for peace...
