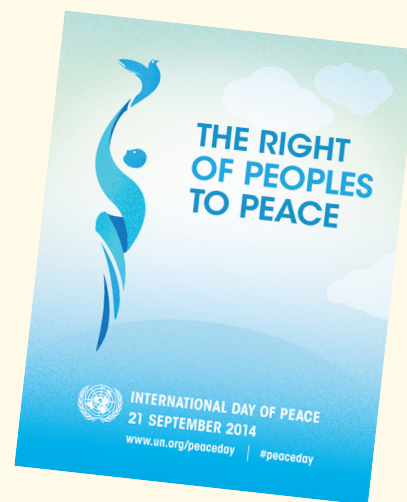
### Who Are the Peacemakers?
