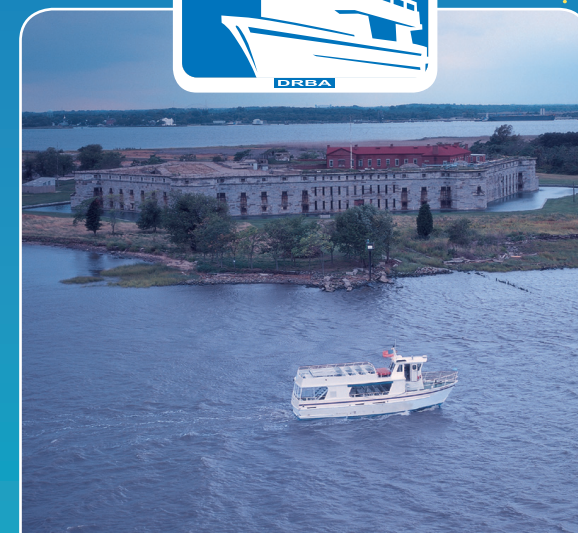

SALEM, NEW JERSEY

With terrific restaurants, myriad shopping and entertainment options and historic buildings centered by the second oldest courthouse in the United States, the city of Salem offers abundant possibilities for travelers. Salem is home to the Hancock House, site of the 1778 British assault known as the Hancock House Massacre.

FORT MOTT, NEW JERSEY

Fort Mott was part of a coastal defense system designed for the Delaware River in the late 1800s. The fortifications seen today at Fort Mott were erected in 1896 in anticipation of the Spanish-American War. Today, visitors can wander through the old batteries, following interpretive signs with detailed descriptions of the fort. Just beyond the fortifications is the shoreline of the Delaware River, offering good spots for walking and picnicking. Food and beverages are not sold at the Fort.

DELAWARE CITY, DELAWARE

Located between the Delaware River and the eastern terminus of the Chesapeake and Delaware Canal, Delaware City has been tied to river life since its founding in 1801. Delaware City is the gateway to many natural and historic treasures, such as the Delaware Estuary marshes, the Chesapeake and Delaware Canal, Fort Delaware and Fort DuPont. Visitors are welcome to enjoy the town's restaurants and shops and to stroll through the Historic District, which has more than 200 structures featuring architectural styles spanning the 19th and early 20th centuries.

FORT DELAWARE STATE PARK

Travel back in time to Fort Delaware, the Union fortress dating back to 1859, which once housed thousands of Confederate prisoners of war (and whose ghosts reportedly still haunt the site). Take a short, leisurely ferry ride on the Delaware River from Delaware City or Salem to Pea Patch Island, where the fort is located. A jitney provides transport from the island dock to the granite and brick fortress. Here, costumed interpreters take you back to the summer of 1864.

Bring a picnic lunch to enjoy in our picnic area – tables and grills are provided. Drink machines are available on the island, but there is no concession stand, so please bring your own food if you wish to enjoy a meal during your visit. Chips and other packaged snacks may be purchased at our gift shops.
